**HISTORY MADE:** **Diana Taurasi** made history on Sunday, June 18 at Los Angeles, surpassing Tina Thompson to become the WNBA's all-time leader in scoring. Taurasi, who became just the third player in WNBA history to reach 7,000 career points last season on June 24 at Washington, entered this season ranked third on the league's all-time scoring list with 7,311 career points, doing so in only 367 games. **Tamika Catchings** ranked second with 7,380 points (457 games) and **Tina Thompson** still ranks first with 7,488 points (496 games)

**DEE FOR THREE:** In Phoenix's 99-91 win on June 1, 2017 at Chicago, **Diana Taurasi** became the league's all-time leader in three-point makes, passing **Katie Smith**. Taurasi entered the game tied with Smith at 906 career made 3-pointers, but exploded for 8 threes to move into the number one spot. Her eight 3-pointers tied as the most made in a WNBA game, which has been done four times; three by Taurasi.

**MEMORABLE MAY 17:** In the Mercury's game on May 17 against Indiana, **Diana Taurasi** recorded her 1,500th-career rebound, becoming the first player in league history to reach 7,000 career points, 1,500 career assists and 1,500 career rebounds.

**BiG START:** Brittney Griner was a beast through the first five games of the season, as her 101 total points, 37 rebounds and 19 blocks made her the first WNBA player in history with at least 100 points, 30 rebounds and 19 blocks through the first five games of the season. Through the Mercury's first three games of

the season, **Brittney Griner** totaled 70 points, 25 rebounds and 9 blocks. She became one of only three players in WNBA history to record at least 70 points, 25 rebounds and 7 blocks in the first three games of the season, and the first since **Lauren Jackson** in 2007. Jackson tallied 70 points, 28 rebounds and 8 blocks through Seattle's first three games in 2007, while **Lisa Leslie** posted 72 points, 31 rebounds and 7 blocks in Los Angeles' first three games of 1999.

**AIN'T NOTHIN BUT A "BG" THANG:** Mercury center **Brittney Griner** continues to prove that she may just be the greatest rim protector in league history, as

she ranks 8th on the WNBA's all-time blocks list with 450 blocks through only four seasons (ranks second among active players behind Sylvia Fowles - 482 blocks in 248 games)...After leading the league in blocks last season for a fourth-straight year with 107, she recorded her third consecutive year with 100+ blocks in a season, becoming just the second WNBA player (Margo Dydek) to do so...Griner averaged 3.1 blocks per game in 2016, making her the first WNBA player in history to average 3.0+ blocks per game in each of her first four seasons...The last player in the NBA to average 3.0 blocks per game in each of his first four seasons in the NBA was Shawn Bradley (1993-94 to 1996-97)...She also became the 11th player in WNBA history to record 400 career blocks on 9/2 at Connecticut...She did so in 115 career games, making her the fastest player in WNBA history to reach 400 career blocks. Manute Bol, David Robinson and Mark Eaton are the only NBA players to have ever recorded 400 career blocks in 115 games or less

**SCORING LEADERS:** Through the first month of the 2017 WNBA season, **Diana Taurasi** and **Brittney Griner** have posted the top-two scoring performances among the entire league this season. Taurasi has the second-highest scoring performance of the year after scoring 37 points on June 1 at Chicago, while Griner has the top scoring performance in the league this season after scoring a career-high 38 points at Indiana on June 7. **There have been five 30+ point scoring performances in the WNBA this season, three of which were done by Griner or Taurasi.**

**DEFENSE WINS CHAMPIONSHIPS:** The Mercury held its first two opponents of the 2017 season to under 70 points (Dallas-68, Indiana-62), marking the first time since 2014 that the Mercury has held its first two opponents of the season to under 70 points and just the second time in 14 years. Additionally, it was the fourth-straight regular season game (final 2 games of 2016 and first 2 games of 2017) the Mercury has held its opponents under 70 points. The last time the Mercury held four-straight opponents under 70 points was from July 5-15 during the 2005 season. Through the first six games of the season, Phoenix has held four opponents under 70 points, something the Mercury has not done since 2003 (held five of first six opponents under 70 points).

**COACHING STAFF:** Mercury head coach **Sandy Brondello** returns for her fourth year with the Mercury....Brondello was signed to a multi-year contract following last season on October 13, 2016.... Brondello is assisted by **Julie Hairgrove** (13th season) and **Todd Troxel** (4th season)....Brondello has a career record of 85-62 as head coach in the WNBA and a 71-42 record with the Mercury as head coach, **which is the most wins in WNBA history by a head coach in**

**their first four years with a team.** She holds the best win percentage (.628) among all Mercury coaches in franchise history who have coached for at least one full season (Russ Pennell coached for 13 games and had a .692 win percentage), and is tied for the most playoff wins by a coach in Mercury history with 11.

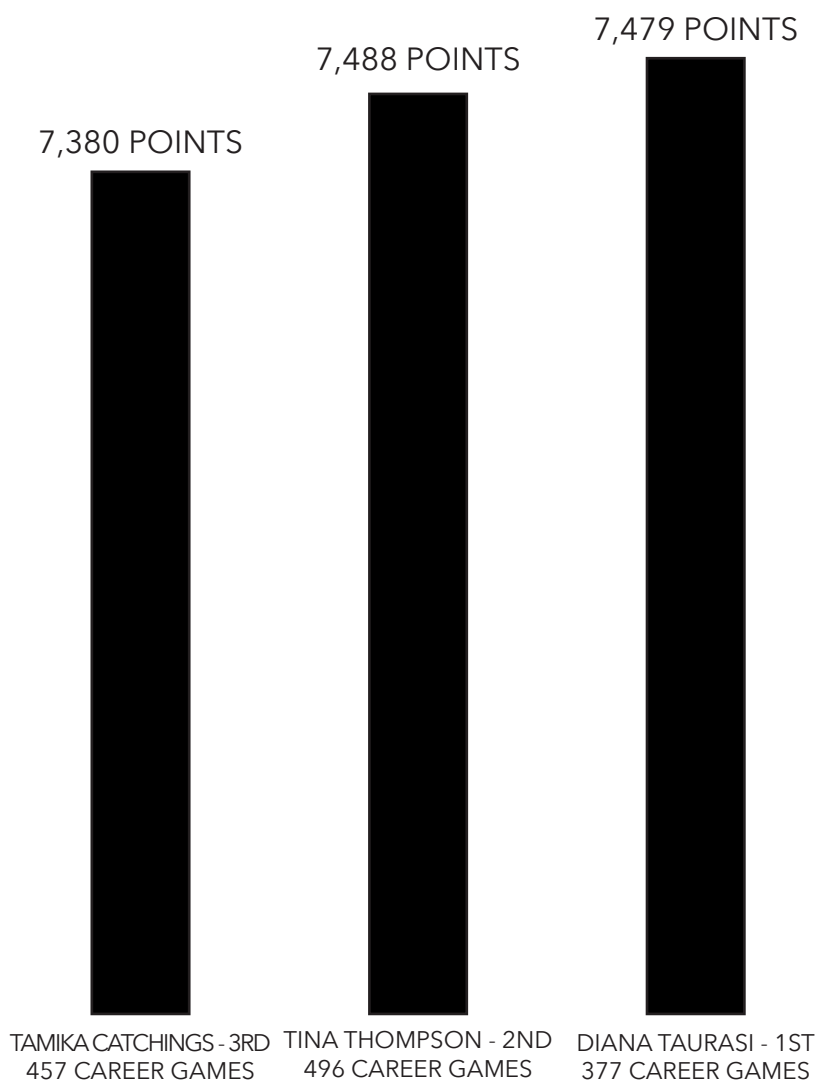
**NEW TO THE MIGHTY MERCURY:** With an entirely re-tooled roster from a year ago, the 2017 Mercury will showcase many new faces in Phoenix. New to this year's team is **Emma Cannon** (free agent), **Cayla George** (free agent, played on 2015 Mercury team), **Camille Little** (acquired via trade from Connecticut), **Leilani Mitchell** (free agent, played on 2015 Mercury team), **Shay Murphy** (free agent, played on 2014 Mercury team), **Danielle Robinson** (acquired via trade from San Antonio), **Stephanie Talbot** (2014 Draft, 33rd overall by Phoenix) and **Yvonne Turner** (free agent).

**'BOUNCE BACK':** Despite the Mercury's 16-18 record last summer, history has been good to Phoenix coming off losing seasons, especially 16-18 records. After finishing 16-18 in 2008, the Mercury rebounded in 2009 by winning the WNBA Championship. Additionally, in the three losing seasons the Mercury has had since 2008 (2008, 2010, 2012), the team finished with a winning record in each of the following years, while also reaching the semifinals.

**TROPHY CASE:** The Mercury won their third WNBA Championship in 2014 and became the third franchise in the then 19-year history of the league with three or more championships.....the Houston Comets (1997, 1998, 1999, 2000) and Detroit Shock (now Dallas, previously Tulsa) (2003, 2006, 2008) are the other two. Minnesota joined the list in 2015, while Los Angeles joined in 2016.

# Sandy Brondello

HEAD COACH

FOURTH SEASON AS HEAD COACH OF PHOENIX • FIFTH



Veteran WNBA player, coach and former Australian Olympian Sandy Brondello (braun-DELL-oh) was named the ninth head coach in franchise history on November 15, 2013. Brondello also serves as the team's vice president of player personnel. On October 13, 2016, the Mercury signed Brondello to a multi-year contract extension

Known for her intense preparation for each opponent, Brondello has compiled an overall record of 55-38 in her first three seasons with the Mercury, ranking her third on the all-time wins list as a Mercury coach. She was named the 2014 WNBA Coach of the Year marking the first time a Mercury coach picked up the honor. She led the team to a WNBA regular season-record 29 wins and capped the season with a WNBA Championship.

An 12-year veteran of the WNBA coaching ranks, Brondello has been affiliated with the league for 18 of the league's 21 seasons, including her time as a player. A proven winner internationally and in the WNBA, her 11 total years as an assistant coach and head coach have featured eight playoff appearances, including five conference finals berths, the 2014 WNBA Championship and a spot in the 2008 WNBA Finals. Brondello joins the Mercury after serving as lead assistant coach for the Los Angeles Sparks (2011-13) under 2012 WNBA Coach of the Year Carol Ross. Brondello led the San Antonio Silver Stars to a 2010 playoff berth in her lone season at the helm following five seasons on the Silver Stars bench as an assistant under Dan Hughes (2005-09), the third-winningest coach in league history.

A 2010 inductee into the Australian Basketball Hall of Fame, Brondello was named the 11th head coach for the Australian Women's National basketball team on April 17, 2017. While she will continue to serve in her role as head coach for the Mercury, Brondello will spend her offseasons preparing the Aussies for a trip to the 2020 Summer Olympics in Tokyo.

During the WNBA offseason, Brondello serves an assistant coach with Russian League team UMMC Ekaterinburg. Now the Mercury's head of player personnel, Phoenix's pro scouting efforts are buoyed by Brondello's knowledge of and exposure to overseas talent.

Brondello finished a stellar 17-year professional playing career with a five-year run in the WNBA in which she played for Detroit (1998-99), Miami (2001-02) and Seattle (2003), and was named a 1999 WNBA All-Star. She began her career with the Women's National Basketball League (WNBL) in Australia (1986-96), and was named the league MVP in 1995. The 5-7 guard was a 10-time German Cup champion while playing with BTV Wuppertal (1992-2002), a three-time European Cup All-Star selection (1994, 1996, 1997), and the 1996 European Cup MVP when she led her team to the title.

An 18-year member of the Australian National Team, Brondello is a four-time Olympian, a two-time silver medalist (2000, 2004) and was named the 1992 Australian International Player of the Year. In her time with the national team, she was a teammate of Mercury forward Penny Taylor.

Brondello is married to Olaf Lange, who is the head coach of UMMC Ekaterinburg, and the couple has two children, Brody and Jayda.

**Highlight:** Taurasi (7,494) just surpassed Tina Thompson (7,488) to become the WNBA's all-time scoring leader. She did it with a right-handed layup with 45.3 seconds remaining in the second quarter at the Los Angeles Sparks on June 18. It marked her 377th career regular season game, meaning she scored 7,488 points 119 games quicker than Thompson, who played 496 career regular season games. Only two other active WNBA players are in the top 10 for points scored over a career, with each over 1,000 points away (Cappie Pondexter and Sue Bird).

## G.O.A.T.

- Taurasi, who just became the WNBA's all-time leading scorer, entered the season third on the scoring list. She passed Tamika Catchings (7,380) for second on the WNBA's all-time scoring list on June 1 at Chicago.
- With Taurasi's first three-point field goal make on June 1 at Chicago, she surpassed Katie Smith (906) to become the WNBA's all-time leader in three-pointers made. She now has 933 career made three-pointers.
- The Mercury great surpassed Katie Smith (2,466) to become the WNBA's all-time leader in three-point attempts on May 17 vs. Indiana.
- Taurasi surpassed Tamika Catchings (2,385) for second on the WNBA's all-time field goals made list on June 10 vs. Los Angeles. Taurasi leads all active players with 2,399 field goals made. Tina Thompson is the all-time leader with 2,630 made field goals over her career.
- Is three steals away from becoming the 28th player in WNBA history to achieve at least 400 career steals
- Has scored 30+ points 42 times in her career, the most in WNBA history

Taurasi is just the second player in WNBA history with 5,000 points, 1,500 rebounds and 1,500 assists (Lindsay Whalen).
- Is averaging 18.3 points per game on the season, her highest scoring average since she finished 2013 scoring 20.3 points per game
- Is one of three active WNBA players with at least 1,500 career rebounds and 150 made three-pointers (Camille Little and Lindsay Whalen)
