TODAY'S OPPONENT:

LOS ANGELES SPARKS

Series Notes: This is the third and final regular season matchup between the Mystics and the Sparks this season. Los Angeles currently lead the series 2-0 this season. The Sparks won the series over the Mystics last season, 3-0.

In their first matchup this season, the Mystics fell in their first road game of the season 99-89 at Los Angeles. Elena Delle Donne had her second performance of 20+ points by leading all scorers with 27 on 8-of-13 shooting. She was a perfect 10-of-10 on free throws. Tayler Hill added 20 points (7-15 FG) while Kristi Toliver chipped in 15 points in her return to Los Angeles where she spent seven seasons. The Mystics' shot .500 from the field (31-62 FG) but allowed Los Angeles to hit at .548 (34-62). Nneka Ogwumike scored 23 points and rookie Sydney Wiese added 22 - hitting six 3-pointers. After falling behind 34-22 in the first quarter, Washington outscored Los Angeles 67-65 in the rest of the game. Los Angeles had a 74-53 lead with 4:16 left in the third quarter but Washington closed on a 17-4 run, capped by Tayler Hill's jumper just before the buzzer, to pull to 78-70. Washington forward Elena Delle Donne scored eight points in the quarter. The Sparks started the fourth-quarter scoring and the Mystics didn't get closer than seven points the rest of the way. Candace Parker and Essence Carson made their season debuts for Los Angeles (2-0) after returning from the Turkish League. Parker had 18 points, eight rebounds and five assists, Chelsea Gray scored 16 and Alana Beard added 12 points. Los Angeles led 59-48 at halftime after shooting 65.6 percent. Wiese started 7 of 7, with five 3-pointers, in her first nine minutes.

In their second matchup this season, The Washington Mystics (10-6) fell to the Los Angeles Sparks (12-3), 76-69 at the Staples Center. Forward Elena Delle Donne led the team with 22 points and five rebounds. She shot 7-16 from the field, 2-5 from three-point range and 6-6 from the free throw line. Delle Donne has scored in double figures every game she has played this season. Forward Tierra Ruffin-Pratt and guard Ivory Latta each added 10 points. In her first game back from overseas play, Emma Meesseman scored 6 points (3-6 FG) and grabbed 4 rebounds. The Mystics set a new Sparks opponent high for points in the 1st quarter with 24 points. Mystics started the 2nd quarter with a 12-3 run. Washington would finish the quarter outscoring the Sparks 23-13 a new Sparks low. Washington limited Los Angeles to a Sparks season low 30 points in the 1st half and were down by 17, 47-30. Elena Delle Donne led all players scoring 16 points in the 1st half. Sparks guard Chelsea Gray and center Candace Parker led the way for Los Angeles recording 17 points a piece.

LAST TIME OUT:

Mystics vs. Indiana Fever (8/12):

- The Washington Mystics (16-10) defeated the Indiana Fever (9-19), 100-80, Saturday night at Capital One Arena. The Mystics lead the regular season series 3-0 and will close out the series on August 20 in Indiana. Washington has now won five of their last six games, and improve to 10-2 at home.
- Five Mystics scored in double figure led by center Krystal Thomas with a career high, 20 points on 7-8 shooting and 14 rebounds.
- Forward Emma Meesseman added 15 points and tied her career high in assists with 7. Meesseman has scored in double figures in 10 consecutive games.
- Guard Shatori Walker-Kimbrough recorded a season high 13 points while Ivory Latta and Allison Hightower chipped in 13 and 10 points off the bench.
- Washington outscored Indiana, 28-16, in the first quarter, and took a 49-36 lead going into halftime. Forward Emma Meesseman led the team with 11 points and five rebounds in the opening half.
- The Mystics recorded season highs in field goal percentage (.576) and three-point percentage (.588).
- Washington outrebounded Indiana, 35-25. Washington has outrebounded their opponent 16 times this season, and holds a 12-4 record when doing so.
- Fever guard Candice Dupree led the way for Indiana with 26 points on 12-18 shooting and 8 rebounds.

Mystics vs. Phoenix Mercury (8/6):

- The Mystics have won four of their last five games with a win in a close, 85-80 matchup against the Mercury. The series is now tied at one a piece with their third and final regular season matchup on Friday, August 18 at Verizon Center.
- Four Mystics players scored in double figures led by guard Kristi Toliver who led all scorers with 20 points, shooting 7-of-12 from the field, 3-of-7 from three-point range, and 3-of-5 from the free throw line.
- Forwards Tierra Ruffin-Pratt and Emma Meesseman added 17 and 15 points respectively while forward Tianna Hawkins added 10 points off the bench along with eight boards.
- The Mystics led 43-38 at the half with the starters contributing 31 of the Mystics 43 points. Ruffin-Pratt and Meesseman led the pack with eight point apiece entering the half.
- At the half, center Krystal Thomas tallied 11 rebounds (four offensive rebounds, seven defensive rebounds). Thomas grabbed 16 boards total, posting her 11th double-digit rebounding effort this season (sixth consecutive).
- With 2:04 remaining in the game, the Mystics held a one-point lead over the Mercury, 81-80. After a fade away jump shot by Toliver with 14.4 seconds left followed by two made free throws with 5.0 seconds left, the Mystics were able to secure the victory.
- Four Mercury players also scored in double figures led by guard Diana Taurasi who scored 16 points. Starting center Angel Robinson added 14 points while guard Yvonne Turner and forward Monique Currie added 15 and 14 points respectively from off the bench.
- The Mercury were without center Britney Griner (left knee bone bruise, right ankle sprain) while the Mystics were without forward Elena Delle Donne (left thumb) and guards Natasha Cloud (right foot) and Tayler Hill (ACL) due to injury.

Mystics at San Antonio Stars (8/4):

- Washington dropped the last regular season matchup against San Antonio, 76-74, but won the series 2-1.
- Guard Kristi Toliver led the Mystics with 18 points on 7-of-14 shooting, including 4-of-8 from beyond the arc and six assists.
- Center Krystal Thomas grabbed 20 rebounds, a career high and the most rebounds a Mystics player has tallied in a single game this season. Previously, Thomas notched 18 rebounds vs. Seattle on September 23, 2012 and 17 vs. Atlanta on July 19 for the team's previous season high.
- Krystal's 20-rebound performance ranks third best in franchise history.
- Tierra Ruffin-Pratt scored a season-high 17 points. Previously, the guard scored 15 points in two other games this season.
- Forward Emma Meesseman added 15 points, 9 rebounds, 6 assists and 2 blocks for the Mystics.
- Washington outrebounded the Stars 38-36.
- Isabelle Harrison led the Stars with 20 points and 10 rebounds to record her fourth double-double of the season. This game marks the third time she has scored 20-plus points and the fourth time she has grabbed 10-plus rebounds.
- Star's Kelsey Plum notched a career-high 12 assists, the most assists a Stars player has recorded in a single game this season. Plum's 12 assists are the most a WNBA rookie has recorded in a game this season.

Through 26 games this season the Mystics have an overall record of 16-10, 11-2 against Eastern Conference opponents, and are ranked second in the East and fourth overall. Last season the Mystics were 10-16 through 26 games, 6-5 against the East and ranked ninth overall.

Mystical Start:

Elena Delle Donne opened the season with back-to-back games of 20+ points, the fourth time she has done so in her career. This season, she has recorded 11 games with 20+ points, and is averaging 18.8 points (sixth in the league), shooting .475 from the field and .949 from the free throw line (second in the league). Delle Donne's output has helped pace the Washington offense that is tied with Los Angeles for fifth overall (second in the East) in scoring (82.7).

KrisTHREE Toliver:

Guard Kristi Toliver is the WNBA's all-time leader in three-point percentage at .398 (476-1196). This season, she is ranked third in the league in three pointers made per game (2.3) and is averaging .353 from beyond the arc. Toliver made a season high 7 threes vs. Atlanta (7/19).

Off the Glass:

The Mystics have outrebounded their opponent in 16 games and tied their opponent in three games this season. The team is ranked second in the league in total rebounds per game (36.7), tied with New York for second in offensive boards per game (10.3) and second in defensive rebounds per game (26.4).

Charity Stripe:

Washington ranks second overall in free throw percentage (84.8). Three Mystics rank among the top five in free throw percentage this season, #1 Tianna Hawkins (.951), #2 Elena Delle Donne (.949), #3 Tayler Hill (.938). Washington made a season high 27 free throws in their win against the San Antonio Stars (5/14). They average 18.3 free throws made per game (third in the league).

Double-Double Watch:

Forward Elena Delle Donne recorded back-to-back double-doubles against the Connecticut Sun (5/31) with 13 points and 12 rebounds and against the Atlanta Dream (6/4) with 23 points and a career high 15 rebounds. She recorded her third double-double of the season with 29 points and 10 rebounds against San Antonio (7/25). Forward Tierra Ruffin-Pratt recorded her first career double-double with 15 points and a career high 10 rebounds against the Chicago Sky (5/24). She posted her second double-double with 11 points and 12 rebounds against Seattle (6/27). Center Krystal Thomas recorded her first double-double of the season against the Fever (6/11). She had season-high's 14 points and 14 rebounds. Forward Emma Meesseman recorded her first double-double of the season with 30 points and 10 rebounds at Atlanta (7/30).

Bench Support:

The Mystics' bench has outscored its opponent in 15 contests this season, and is averaging 24.3 points per game. They produced a season high 43 points at Chicago (6/25).

Breaking 100:

The Mystics recorded a season high 101 points against the Wings (6/6). They also posted 100 points against Seattle (6/27), in their OT victory against Atlanta (7/19) and against Indiana (8/12) marking the fourth time this season that they've scored 100+ points. Last season, they recorded two games of 100+ points.

Defending Home Court:

Washington started the season 4-0 at home before falling to Minnesota (6/9). This was the first time they started a season with a 4-0 home streak since the 2006 season when they went 7-0 at home to start the season. Through 26 games, the Mystics hold a 10-2 record at home this season.

Hot Streak:

Washington won its fifth game in a row against the Dallas Wings on 6/6. The last time they had a 5 game win streak was during the 2015 season (7/17-31).

200 Club:

Mystics' head coach, Mike Thibault had his 275th career victory against the Atlanta Dream (6/4). Thibault has the most career coaching victories in league history, a milestone he reached during the 2013 season.

Delle Donne's All-Star Selection:

Forward Elena Delle Donne has been selected as a starter in the 2017 WNBA All-Star Game. This is her fourth straight All-Star selection. Delle Donne received more fan votes than any other player in Eastern Conference, finishing only behind Maya Moore of the Minnesota Lynx.

Friendly Foes:

Mystics' newcomer Kristi Toliver will return to Los Angeles to face her former Sparks team. Last year, Toliver was a part of the 2016 WNBA Champion Los Angeles Sparks team before returning to her Maryland roots. Mystics guard Tayler Hill will face her former collegiate teammate from The Ohio State University, Jantel Lavender. Sparks guard/forward Alana Beard is a familiar face to the Mystics. Beard was selected with the second overall pick in the 2004 WNBA Draft by the Mystics before signing with the Sparks in the off-season prior to 2012.

Four More Years:

Head Coach Mike Thibault signed a four-year contract extension. Thibault was first named the team's head coach and general manager on Dec. 18, 2012. During his tenure at the helm of the Mystics basketball operations, he has led the team to three consecutive playoff appearances (2013, 2014 and 2015). During the 2013 season, Thibault became the WNBA's all-time winningest coach and received his third Coach of the Year recognition following the regular season. Thibault recently engineered one of the most impactful off seasons in league history when he acquired Olympian and WNBA MVP Elena Delle Donne and signed All-Star and WNBA Champion Kristi Toliver prior to the season.

Capital Debut:

In her first regular season game, Elena Delle Donne played 23 minutes and led the team with 24 points on 8 for 11 shooting and grabbed five rebounds. The former WNBA MVP was acquired by the Mystics during the offseason. Back on the East Coast, Delle Donne is closer to her hometown in Wilmington, Delaware. She was a four-year star at University of Delaware.

Familiar Faces:

The Mystics are returning six of last season's roster players. Natasha Cloud, Tianna Hawkins, Tayler Hill, Ivory Latta, Emma Meesseman and Tierra Ruffin-Pratt all played during the 2016 season.

DD to DC:

The Mystics acquired forward Elena Delle Donne from the Chicago Sky in exchange for center Stefanie Dolson, guard Kahleah Copper and Washington's first round pick (second overall) in the 2017 WNBA draft.

The 6-5 forward was selected second overall by the Sky in the 2013 WNBA Draft. Delle Donne has distinguished herself as one of the WNBA's most decorated players over her four-year career, earning league MVP honors in 2015, three All-Star selections as a starter (2013-15, no WNBA All-Star Game in 2016), two All-WNBA First Team and one All-WNBA Second Team selections and the 2013 Rookie of the Year award in addition to being named to the U.S. Women's National Team that competed in the 2016 Summer Olympics in Rio De Janeiro, Brazil. She has also been recognized for her efforts off the court, earning the 2015 WNBA Community Assist award and the Dawn Staley Community Leadership award in 2014 and 2015.

Delle Donne has averaged 20.5 points, 6.6 rebounds and 1.7 blocks per game over her four-year career and has led her team to the playoffs each year, including a trip to the WNBA Finals in 2014. She averaged a career-best 23.4 points per game and 8.4 rebounds per game on her way to being named the league's MVP and earning All-WNBA First Team honors in 2015. Last season, she averaged 21.5 points, 7.0 rebounds and 1.5 blocks in 28 games.

Kristi Toliver is Coming Home to the DMV:

A 5-7 guard from the University of Maryland, Toliver was selected in the first round (third overall) of the 2009 WNBA draft by the Chicago Sky after helping the Terrapins win the 2006 NCAA Championship, the first for the women's program. Following her rookie season, she was traded to the Sparks where spent the last seven years and helped the team make five consecutive playoff appearances before the winning the championship in 2016. During her championship season Toliver averaged 14.8 points and 4.1 assists. She has compiled career averages of 13.2 points per game and 3.7 assists per game.

Krystal Thomas and Asia Taylor to the Mystics:

Krystal Thomas, the 6-5 center was selected in the third round (36th overall) of the 2011 WNBA draft by the Seattle Storm. In the last five years, she has been a member of the Storm, Phoenix Mercury and Indiana Fever and has career averages of 3.0 points per game and 4.0 rebounds per game. During the 2012 season with the Mercury, she set the franchise record for offensive rebounds in a season with 93.

Forward Asia Taylor who was also the 36th overall selection in the 2014 WNBA Draft by the Minnesota Lynx. The 6'1 guard was part of the Connecticut Sun for the latter part of the 2016 season and averaged 2.8 points per game and 1.3 rebounds per game. Prior to the 2017 season, Taylor was playing in Australia in the Women's National Basketball League where she averaged 17.3 points per game and grabbed 8.4 rebounds per game.

Mystics Unveil 20th Anniversary Logo:

The 2017 WNBA season will commemorate the 20th anniversary of the Washington Mystics. To celebrate the occasion, the team will unveil a logo that will reflect the

milestone and be used throughout the upcoming season.

The Mystics joined the metropolitan area's sport landscape in 1997 before tipping off their inaugural season on June 11, 1998, against the Charlotte Sting. Washington is one of three WNBA franchises to have hosted multiple All-Star games (2002, 2007).

The logo is made up of three main elements: a large platinum 20 with the word "seasons" etched on the base of the number two indicating that the team is celebrating its 20th season, the Mystics primary logo to identify the team name and colors, and a ribbon featuring the date 1998 the year the team was established.

The platinum 20 is intentionally large to represent the significance of reaching the 20th season milestone. Throughout the season the Mystics will host events acknowledging their past, and honoring those loyal fans that have been with the team since the inaugural season.

Monumental Sports & Entertainment (MSE), located in Washington, D.C., is one of the largest integrated sports and entertainment companies in the country with one of the most diverse partnership groups in all of sports. MSE owns and operates five professional sports teams: the AFL's Washington Valor, NBA's Washington Wizards, NHL's Washington Capitals, WNBA's Washington Mystics and a soon to be named Baltimore AFL team to debut in 2017. COACHING STAFF

Mike Thibault

General Manager & Head Coach

Mike Thibault was named the head coach/general manager of the Washington Mystics on December 18, 2012. He is the winningest coach in WNBA history with 270 wins and has led the Mystics to three consecutive playoff appearances for the first time in franchise history. He was named the WNBA Coach of the Year for the 2013 season.

Thibault recently orchestrated what is arguably considered one of the biggest player moves in WNBA history when the Mystics acquired All-Star Elena Delle Donne and signed WNBA Champion Kristi Toliver.

Prior to joining the Mystics, Thibault was the head coach of the Connecticut Sun where he was twice named WNBA Coach of the Year (2006, 2008) and led the team to eight playoff appearances and two WNBA Finals. He set numerous milestones during his time with the Sun, including becoming the second coach in WNBA history to reach 200 wins, the third-fastest coach in league history to reach 100 wins (doing so in 159 games) and the fourth WNBA head coach to work at least 300 regular season games.

From 2003 through 2008, Thibault and the Connecticut Sun won 127 regular season games, tying with the Detroit Shock for the most victories during that six-year span. The Sun were one of two teams to have six consecutive winning seasons. Connecticut posted consecutive 26-8 records in 2005 and 2006, which are still the best regular season results for an Eastern Conference team.

Thibault assisted in the blockbuster trade that sent Lindsay Whalen and the No. 2 pick in the 2010 WNBA Draft to Minnesota in exchange for second-year guard Renee Montgomery and the No. 1 pick in 2010, which the team used to select Tina Charles. Under Thibault's tutelage, Charles was named the league's MVP in 2012.

Thibault joined the professional coaching ranks in 1978 as a scout for the Los Angeles Lakers and was quickly promoted to Director of Scouting and assistant coach in 1980. During his tenure with the Lakers, the team won two NBA Championships. From 1982-1986, he served as the Director of Player Personnel and assistant coach for the Chicago Bulls when the organization selected Michael Jordan, Charles Oakley and traded for John Paxson.

Thibault served as the general manager and head coach of the Omaha Racers of the Continental Basketball Association (CBA) where his team captured the league's title in 1993. During his tenure with the Racers, the team made eight consecutive playoff appearances, and Thibault was named the 1993 Sportsman of the Year by Omaha broadcasters. He ranks sixth on the CBA all-time coaching victory list (236). Thibault also coached the Calgary 88's of the World Basketball League (WBL) where he received Coach of the Year honors in 1988.

Following his time in Omaha, Thibault was a scout for the Seattle Sonics and immediately prior to joining the Sun in 2003, he was an assistant coach with the Milwaukee Bucks for four seasons.

Thibault has had an extensive collaboration with USA Basketball. He most recently served as an assistant coach to the women's National Team that won gold during the 2008 Beijing Olympics. He was on the coaching staff of the 2006 National Team that captured bronze during the World Championships, was the head coach of the men's team that won the gold medal at the 1993 FIBA World Championship qualifying tournament and was also at the helm of the men's team that won the silver medal at the 1995 Pan American Games.

Mike and his wife Nanci have been staunch supporters of the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation since Mike's days with the Omaha Racers. In 2007, the Thibaults were co-chairs of GREAT STRIDES, the primary fundraiser of the CF Foundation's Connecticut Chapter. Mike and Nanci have two children. Eric is an assistant coach with the Mystics while Carly is an assistant coach at Mississippi State University.

Marianne Stanley - Assistant Coach

Hall of Famer Marianne Stanley returns for her seventh season on the Washington Mystics bench. In 2016, she was inducted in the Virginia Sports Hall of Fame. Stanley and her Immaculata College teammates were elected to the Naismith Hall of Fame in 2015. Stanley has over 20 years of coaching experience at the collegiate level with stops at Old Dominion, Stanford, University of California-Berkeley and University of Southern California and is the winner of five National Championships as a player and a coach. She was also named Coach of the Year while at Immaculata in 1979 and Stanford in 1996. Stanley is also very familiar with the WNBA. In addition to her stop in Washington where she earned coach of the Year honors in 2002, she has also been an assistant coach with the Los Angeles Sparks and the New York Liberty. Stanley has earned numerous accolades throughout her career. She was named the Pac-10 Conference Coach of the Year in 1993, the Sun Belt Conference Coach of the Year in 1984 and 1985, and an All-American selection as a player in 1975 and 1976 at Immaculata College.

Eric Thibault - Assistant Coach

Eric Thibault is in his fifth season as an assistant coach with the Washington Mystics. He has had stints with Virginia Commonwealth University and the Connecticut Sun. During the 2012-13 season, Thibault assisted with the recruiting process and player development for VCU. He played an integral role in the team's transition to the Atlantic-10 conference. As a member of the Sun's coaching staff, Thibault was responsible for preparing reports on opponent personnel, conducting individual workouts with players, managing season statistics, constructing opponent film edits, and scouting opponents. He has also worked on the floor with WNBA All-Star point guards Kara Lawson, Lindsay Whalen, and Renee Montgomery.
