TODAY'S OPPONENT

The Dream (4-4) travel to Mohegan Sun Arena to take on the Connecticut Sun in their second of back-to-back games this weekend. Tip-off is scheduled for 7:00 PM (ET) and the game will also be webcast live at www.AtlantaDream.net. The Dream won the last meeting in Connecticut 67-62 on June 14.

Both teams are looking to climb the standings with a win, as they are both in the mix in the Eastern Conference. The Dream are coming off a 96-86 victory over the Detroit Shock on Friday night in which they shot a franchise record 56.1% from the field.

The Dream starters got back on track as Chamique Holdsclaw led the team with a season-high 28 points on 10-15 shooting from the field. Erika de Souza recorded her second double-double of the season with a career-high 20 points and 13 rebounds. Sancho Lyttle finished with 12 points for her eighth consecutive game in double figures, and Izi Castro Marques added 11. Nikki Teasley scored seven points and dished out a season-high 11 assists (tied the franchise record).

The Sun are led by forward Asjha Jones and guard Lindsay Whalen. Jones is averaging 15 points, six rebounds, and two assists per game, while Whalen is averaging 11.8 points, five rebounds and five assists per game. The Sun (3-3) are looking to move over the .500 mark on the season after a slow start. Connecticut won only one of their first four games, and they are currently riding a two game winning streak.

The Sun won their second consecutive game last Sunday at home against the San Antonio Silver Stars. Jones scored a team high 19 points, and Erin Phillips added 11 as she went 5-8 from the field while grabbing four rebounds in the 71-58 Connecticut victory.

This is the second matchup this season between the two teams. The Dream won the first game 67-62 in Connecticut on June 14 behind Sancho Lyttle's 20-point, 15-rebound performance. Chamique Holdsclaw (12) and Erika de Souza (10) also finished in double figures as the Dream shot 47% from the field. The Sun were led by Lindsay Whalen with 16 points, seven rebounds and five assists.

Atlanta's Erika de Souza played for Connecticut in 2007, averaging four points and three rebounds per game. Tonight's matchup will also feature a meeting between former University of Georgia teammates Keisha Brown and Coco Miller.

NEXT OPPONENT

The Dream head back to Philips Arena to take on the Minnesota Lynx. Atlanta is 1-1 all time vs. Minnesota. This is the first matchup between the two teams this season. The game will be nationally televised on ESPN2.

NEWS AND NOTES

DREAM MATCHES LAST SEASON'S WIN TOTAL

With a 96-86 victory over the defending champions, the Detroit Shock on Friday night, the Dream matched their win total for the entire 2008 season, moving to 4-4 on the year. The Dream started last season 0-17 before finishing with a 4-30 record. They did not record their fourth win of the season until September 11.

SETTING THE STANDARD

The Dream set multiple team and individual highs during a 96-86 victory over the Detroit Shock on Friday night. Atlanta shot a franchise record 56.1% from the field and a season-high 45.5% from beyond the arc. The team's 96 points was the second-highest total of the season. Chamique Holdsclaw scored a season-high 28 points, the best mark this year by a Dream player. Erika de Souza added a career-high 20 points and Nikki Teasley dished out a season-high 11 assists. Teasley's 11 assists were a team high this season and tied the franchise record set last year by Kristin Haynie. Teasley's 11 assists were also two more than the entire Detroit team recorded in the game (Detroit finished with nine assists as a team).

LYTTLE EXTENDS SCORING STREAK

Sancho Lyttle has scored in double figures every game this season, extending her streak to eight games. Lyttle is currently the Dream's second leading scorer (14.6 ppg) and second leading rebounder (7.5 rpg). She also ranks second in field goal percentage (.597) on the team.

DREAM DOMINATING THE PAINT

The Atlanta Dream have outscored their opponents under the basket in seven out of the first eight games of the season. This surge of inside scoring can be attributed to the duo of Sancho Lyttle (14.6 ppg, 7.5 rpg) and Erika de Souza (12 ppg, 8.0 rpg), who are both close to averaging double-doubles. Lyttle and de Souza have two double-doubles each this season.

A BALANCED ATTACK

Currently 10 of 11 Dream players are averaging double digits in minutes played and six of those players are averaging over 15 minutes per game. In Tuesday's loss to Chicago, the Dream bench made valuable contributions as Angel McCoughtry and Jennifer Lacy each finished in double figures as they led an 18 point fourth quarter comeback. The bench accounted for 55.1% of the Dream's total offense (54 of 98 points) against the Sky.

MILESTONES FOR MIQUE

It took only 2 minutes and 37 seconds in Chamique Holdsclaw's return to the WNBA on June 6 for the forward to reach another milestone in her WNBA career. Holdsclaw's steal at the 7:23 minute mark in the first quarter against the Fever put

her over the 300 mark for her career. After scoring 23 points during season opener, Holdsclaw was two points shy of 4,000. It would take only 1:46 into the first quarter for her to reach that milestone as she would make both free throws after being fouled by Monique Currie. Holdsclaw is only the ninth player in WNBA history to score more than 4,000 career points.

DREAM GETS A MAKEOVER

After finishing last season with a league worst 4-30 record, the Atlanta Dream overhauled the roster. The Dream's roster now features just four players returning from last year's expansion team. Replacing them is a mixture of free agent signees, draft picks and notable veterans. Iziane Castro-Marques, Erika De Souza, Tamera Young and Jennifer Lacy are the only returning players, as the Dream look to rebound from last season's dismal record. De Souza, who is projected to be a starter, missed 22 games last season while plagued by injury.

DREAM GOES RED

On Tuesday, June 30 the Atlanta Dream will host the Minnesota Lynx for the team's annual "Go Red" game to increase awareness about the importance of heart health. The Dream will recognize local heart disease survivors, who will participate in the team's ceremonial ball exchange prior to the game. In addition, Dream players will take the Go Red Heart CheckUp and will sign up for the new Go Red BetterU program, which gives women the choice to achieve an improved state of well-being and heart health – in just 12 weeks.

ALL-STAR RACE UNDERWAY

All-Star voting is officially underway now through July 7. Five Dream players are candidates on the ballot, highlighted by six-time All-Star Chamique Holdsclaw (1999-2003, 2005). Also on the ballot are two-time All-Stars Nikki Teasley (2002, 2003) and Michelle Snow (2005, 2006). Forwards Erika de Souza and Angel McCoughtry are both seeking their first appearance. Fans can cast their vote online or in arena now through July 7. Following the completion of fan voting, starting line-ups will be announced on July 14 during the nationally-televised Sun vs. Los Angeles Sparks game on ESPN2. The 2009 WNBA All-Star Game will be nationally televised on ABC at 3:30 PM EST on Sunday, July 25.

General Manager and Head Coach Marynell Meadors makes her fourth stop in the WNBA, bringing with her more than 35 years of coaching experience. Meadors enters her second season as General Manager and Head Coach of the Dream where she looks to turn around a team that finished 4-30 as an expansion team in 2008. As General Manager of the Dream, Meadors has made some notable acquisitions, including the signings of six-time WNBA All-Star Chamique Holdsclaw and highly coveted free agent center Michelle Snow this offseason.

Prior to joining the Dream, Meadors spent the previous three seasons as an assistant coach for the Washington Mystics. There she helped head coaches Richie Adubato and Tree Rollins to an aggregate record of 50-52, including a playoff appearance in 2006. Meadors aided the Mystics' rapid turnaround in 2007 when the squad narrowly missed the playoffs – they were eliminated on the final day of the season – after an 0-8 start.

Meadors also served as the first General Manager and Head Coach of the now-defunct Charlotte Sting where she led the franchise to the playoffs in each of its first two seasons. She also served as the Sting's director of player and staff personnel.

Following her tenure with the Sting, Meadors moved south where she was hired as the director of scouting for the Miami Sol. With the Sol, her responsibilities included advanced scouting of opponents and player evaluations for the WNBA Draft.

Meadors has an extensive background in the women's college game. For two seasons prior to joining the Mystics, she served as an assistant coach for the University of Pittsburgh, focusing her efforts on recruiting, scheduling, scouting, academics and community involvement.

Meadors was a head coach at Florida State and Tennessee Tech for a combined 30 years. At Florida State, she quickly turned the program around from three straight losing seasons prior to her arrival. The apex of her tenure came in 1991 when the Seminoles won the Metro Conference Championship and advanced to second round of the NCAA Tournament where they fell to Western Kentucky. A year earlier, she drove the Seminoles to the NCAA Tournament, though the squad was unable to advance past the opening round.

Before heading to Florida State, Meadors earned her stripes at Tennessee Tech where she won more than 300 games as head coach. She was the first head coach of the women's basketball program and in her 20 years at the helm, she posted a school-record .723 winning percentage. During her tenure, she received numerous accolades, including two Ohio Valley Conference (OVC) Coach of the Year awards and a Metro Conference Coach of the Year award. While at Tennessee Tech, she steered her Golden Eagles squads to four OVC championships and two Metro Conference titles and became the first major women's college coach to win 350 games at one institution.
