





**2009 Notes:**

**Last Game:** While shooting just 2-9 from the floor, and 0-3 from beyond the arc, she was 9-9 at the foul line and totaled 13 points to go with five rebounds and a season-best five assists in 32 minutes vs. the Sparks, 6/12. Against L.A., she also had three steals and no turnovers.

- She is fourth in the league with an average of 2.5 spg and is second on the team with 3.0 apg.
- In 32+ minutes of play, she added 14 points for the Fever and pulled down seven rebounds vs. Seattle, 6/9. Against the Storm, she shot 1-5 from 3-pt range and hit 9-12 FT.
- Though she struggled with her shot (5-18 FG), she managed to tally 15 points to go with a team-high nine rebounds and a game-high five steals vs. Atlanta, 6/6. Her five thefts were the most by any player in the WNBA on the season's opening night. She also had four assists against the Dream.
- Going without a rebound for the first time in her career, she scored eight points with an assist in 21 minutes vs. Minnesota, 6/7.

**Career & Personal Highlights**

- Indiana's "do-everything" forward returns for her ninth season in the WNBA after finally healing from a right Achilles tear sustained in Game 3 of the Eastern Conference Finals at Detroit, 9/3/07
- She missed nine games during the 2008 campaign and never fully recovered from her rehabilitation until after the Olympics and the close of the 2008 WNBA Playoffs
- Catchings led the Fever in points per game, rebounds, assists and steals in each of her first six active pro seasons – no other WNBA player has led her team in as many categories in even one of those seasons
- Named the WNBA's Defensive Player of the Year in 2005 and 2006, she has finished among the top three in balloting for the WNBA MVP Award in four of her seven active pro seasons, asserting herself as one of the world's premier players
- She has scored in every game (212) of her pro career
- She is a five-time WNBA All-Star and six-time All-WNBA recipient
- She has earned WNBA Player of the Week honors 11 times through six seasons, second in WNBA history to Lisa Leslie's 14.

**2009 Notes:**

**Last Game:** She led the Fever to a 73-61 win over her hometown team with 14 points on 5-8 FG, 2-2 3-pt FG and 2-4 FT against the Sparks, 6/12. She also had four rebounds, a season-high tying three steals and two blocked shots against L.A.

- Tied for second on the team with a total of eight steals, she is the only Fever player to have at least one theft in all four games to date.
- After totaling just 13 points (5-15 FG, 2-4 3-pt FG, 1-1 FT) in the first two games, she has scored at least 14 in each of the last two. In the last two, she has shot 10-22 FG, 2-5 3-pt FG and 10-12 FT.

- Playing a season-high 35+ minutes vs. Seattle, 6/9, she garnered 18 points and shot 8-8 FT. She also contributed six rebounds, four assists, three steals and a blocked shot in the victory over the Storm.
- In the home-opener vs. Minnesota, 6/7, she had a starters-high six rebounds to go with nine points, one assist and a steal in 18 minutes. Including 2-3 from 3-pt range, she shot 3-7 FG against the Lynx.
- In nearly 28 minutes of the season-opener at Atlanta, 6/6, she had four points, five rebounds, two assists, a steal and a blocked shot. She shot just 2-8 from the floor against the Dream and missed her only attempt from beyond the 3-pt arc.

**Career & Personal Highlights**

- One of the Fever's most charismatic and animated personalities, she was rewarded as the WNBA's Most Improved Player in 2008 after posting career numbers in scoring, rebounds, 3-point field goals, assists and steals
- She has ranked among WNBA leaders in rebounds per 40 minutes during each of her five pro seasons
- She has started 76 games the past three seasons and her 164 career games are second in franchise history behind Tamika Catchings (212)
- She enters the 2009 season ranked third in franchise history in minutes (3,277), fourth in games started (89), second in total rebounds (772) and fifth in points scored (884). She is 116 points from becoming the fourth Fever player with 1,000 points (Catchings, Tan White, Natalie Williams).

**2009 Notes:**

**Last Game:** She led the Indiana bench with eight points, four assists and three rebounds in a reserves-high 22 minutes vs. the Sparks, 6/12. She added the first blocked shot of her career vs. L.A. Her five free throws made against the Sparks are her career best.

- In her first non-starting game of the season, she recorded four rebounds, two assists and a steal in just over 13 minutes of play.
- While leading the starters with two steals and three assists, she added five points and a rebound in 20 minutes in the home-opener vs. Minnesota, 6/7.

- While logging 39 minutes in her regular season debut, she had no turnovers and dealt a game-high five assists against the Dream, 6/6. She added 10 points, including 4-6 FT, vs. Atlanta. Her five assists were the most by any Fever player in 2009 (regular season or preseason).

**Career & Personal Highlights**

- The Fever's first round pick in the 2009 WNBA Draft, she was the 2008 and 2009 Pac-10 Defensive Player of the Year while playing at Arizona State.
- She was also a First Team All-Pac 10 selection in 2009, as well as an honorable mention All-American choice by AP in 2008 and by the AP and WBCA in 2009.
- She ended her career as the Sun Devils' all-time leader in assists (538) and free throw percentage (.830). She was also among the Sun Devils' all-time leaders in steals (second, 272), free throws (second, 401), 3-pt field goal percentage (fourth, .399), 3-pt field goals (fifth, 132) and scoring (seventh, 1,317 points).
- In 2008-09, she set the school's single-season record for 3-pt field goals (65) and she is the only player in school history to lead the team in steals and assists four straight years.
- She ended the regular season second in the nation in 3-pt FG pct. (.469) and 12th in assist-to-turnover ratio (2.1-to-1).
- In Pac-10 play, she was first in assists (4.7 apg), 3-pt FG percentage (.469) and assist-to-turnover ratio, second in steals (2.3 spg) and fourth in FT pct. (.840) and 3-pt FGS per game (2.0).
- She averaged 13.8 points, 5.8 assists and 1.5 steals in ASU's four NCAA Tournament games.
- She recorded a season-best nine assists four times (one short of her career best and the second-highest single-game total in the Pac-10 in 2008-09 and had five or more steals four times, including a season-high six vs. Florida).

**2009 Notes:**

**Last Game:** In her first appearance for the Fever, she was the first player off the Indiana bench vs. L.A. and scored two points with two rebounds in just under 18 minutes against her former teammates.

- That was her first regular season appearance since being waived by L.A. before the 2009 campaign began.
- In her first four WNBA seasons, she averaged 2.9 ppg and 2.2 rpg while logging 14.0 minutes per game.

**Career & Personal Highlights**

- .Originally drafted in the second round of the 2005 WNBA Draft by Charlotte, she played six games for the Sting before being waived. She signed with L.A. in July 2005 and played 15 games for the Sparks.
- She enjoyed her best WNBA season in 2006, starting 33 of 34 games for L.A. and averaging 4.3 ppg and 2.9 rpg in 19.3 mpg.
- She was a member of three NCAA Division I titles at Connecticut, where she played every game and posted a record of 132-13 in four seasons.
- A native of Palmer, Alaska, she was the named that state's Gatorade Player of the Year twice, while also playing varsity volleyball at Colony High School.
