1997

11-11-97 Detroit is officially accepted into the WNBA.

1998

1-12-98 Detroit unveils the Shock nickname and logo and introduces Nancy Lieberman-Cline as franchise's first-ever general manager/head coach.

6-13-98 Shock falls to Charlotte, 78-69, as 15,574 fans support Detroit's first game in franchise history at The Palace of Auburn Hills.

Shock defeats the Washington Mystics in the nations' capital 70-57, recording the first win in franchise history.

8-19-98 Detroit closes out its highly successful inaugural season with 82-68 victory over the New York Liberty in front of a Palace season-high 16,246 Shock fans. Detroit's 17-13 record and .56 winning percentage marks the highest winning percentage by an expansion team in the history professional sports, including WNBA/NBA, NFL, MLB and NHL.

1999

7-6-99 Guard Sandy Brondello scores a franchise-high 33 points at Utah. Brondello hits a three-pointer at the buzzer to send the game into overtime and hits another three-pointer at the overtime buzzer to send the game into a second overtime as the Shock lose the highest scoring game in WNBA history 104-94 at Utah. Brondello broke nine Shock offensive records while the high scoring affair broke 24 overall records.

7-14-99 Guard Sandy Brondello scores a team tri-high eight points as the Eastern Conference All-Stars fell to the first-ever All-Star MVP Lisa Leslie and the Western Conference All-Stars 79-61 in front of a sold out Madison Square Garden (18,649). (Brondello was voted a WNBA Eastern Conference All-Star by the Eastern Conference coach's for the WNBA's inaugural All-Star game in New York City.)

7-23-99 Shock wins what would be its season-high fifth straight game, 69-60, at Cleveland's Gund Arena. However, forward Rachael Sporn was lost for the season with a torn ACL and MCL in her right knee and forward Dominique Canty, forward Astou Ndiaye and center Val Whiting were all suspended one game each for fighting. Cleveland forward Tracy Henderson was suspended two games for fighting.

7-29-99 Shock makes blockbuster trade with Utah Starzz, sending guard Korie Hilde and forward Cindy Brown to Utah in exchange for forward Wendy Palmer and forward Olympia Scott-Richardson in the league's first-ever multi-player two-for-two trade.

8-2-99 Newly acquired forward Wendy Palmer scores her 1,000th career WNBA point versus the Washington Mystics.

8-21-99 Led by guard Jennifer Azzi's game-high 27 points, the Shock defeats the Orlando Miracle 74-68, clinching the franchise's first-ever WNBA playoff berth as the Eastern Conference's #2 seed.

8-24-99 The #2 seed Detroit Shock hosts the franchise's first-ever WNBA Playoff game at The Palace versus the visiting #3 seed Charlotte Sting. The Shock fell 60-54 in Round One of the 1999 WNBA Playoffs.

2000

5-17-00 Shock plays first-ever home preseason game at The Palace versus the Western Conference Phoenix Mercury.

6-18-00 Detroit sets numerous WNBA, franchise and individual records in its 111-74 victory over 2000 expansion Indiana Fever at The Palace. For the WNBA, the Shock set new marks for most points in a game by a team (111), most points in a half by a team (66), and combined for most free throw attempts in a game (88) and most personal fouls in a game (70). Shock team records include new marks for most points in a game (111), most points in a half (66), largest margin of victory (37), highest field goal percentage (.593), most field goals (35), and most free throws made (40), most free throw attempts (54) and most steals (20).

6-28-00 Shock forward Wendy Palmer scores for a career-high 32 points versus 2000 expansion Seattle Storm at Key Arena helping Detroit to an 82-78 victory.

7-12-00 Wendy Palmer, for the first time in her WNBA career, is named to the 2000 WNBA All-Star team as a reserve.

- 7-21-00 After grabbing 12 rebounds in Detroit's heartbreaking 76-74 overtime loss to eventual league champion Houston at The Palace, Wendy Palmer becomes only the second player in WNBA history to record 750 rebounds.
- 9-20-00 Shock promotes Greg Williams to Head Coach/Director of Player Personnel, the franchise's second Head Coach in its four-year history.

- Shock fan favorites and 1998 inaugural season members Carla Boyd (Porter) and Rachael Sporn return to the Shock after taking the 2000 WNBA season off to train and participate for the 2000 Summer Olympic games...Boyd and Porter helped Team Australia win the silver medal in women's basketball team play competition, falling short to a WNBA-filled Team USA roster in the gold medal game.
- Shock conducts its league-record 1,000th all-time community relations appearance when holding its first-ever "Neighborhood Dribble" throughout metro Detroit.
- Shock registers its 50th all-time regular season win with a 75-71 home victory over Phoenix...The victory also marked the Shock's first-ever victory over the Mercury.
- The Shock, finishing 2001 in a four-way tie with Indiana, Seattle and Washington at 10-22, lands the second overall pick in the 2002 WNBA Draft via the WNBA's first-ever Draft Lottery...Seattle wins the draft lottery and the coveted #1 overall pick, with Washington finishing third and Indiana fourth.

- 2-7-02 Shock Head Coach/Director of Player Personnel Greg Williams names Frank Schneider lead assistant coach...Schneider joins Williams and assistant coach Tom Cross on the bench for the 2002 WNBA season.
- Shock announces color change to uniforms and logo to mirror NBA brethren Detroit Pistons traditional red, white and blue.
- Palace Sports & Entertainment President and CEO Tom Wilson names Kristin Bernert Vice President of Shock Operations and former Detroit Piston Bill Laimbeer Shock Special Consultant.
- 5-21-02 Shock rookie forward Swin Cash visits the White House in recognition of the University of Connecticut women's basketball team's perfect 39-0 season and 2002 National Championship victory.
- Shock celebrates fifth anniversary season by opening 2002 WNBA campaign at the Eastern Conference's Orlando Miracle.
- 6-9-02 Shock forward Wendy Palmer becomes just the fifth player in WNBA history to grab 1,000 rebounds for her career during a 70-63 loss to the New York Liberty at The Palace.
- Shock relieves Head Coach Greg Williams of his duties and hires Bill Laimbeer as new Head Coach/Director of Player Personnel.
- 7-11-02 Forward Swin Cash receives the WNBA Community Assist Award for her outstanding community outreach during the month of June 2002.
- Newly acquired point guard Elaine Powell falls just three rebounds and two assists shy of becoming only the third player in WNBA history to record a triple-double.
- Swin Cash records 24 points and 14 rebounds against Cleveland for her seventh career double-double, already ranking her third on Detroit's all-time list.
- Swin Cash sets a new Shock single-season scoring record by tallying 10 points against Charlotte...She finished the season with 474 points, 33 more than Wendy Palmer's previous record, set in 2000.
- Shock hires Flint natives Laurie Byrd and Pamela McGee as assistant coaches.

2002 Season in Review



REVIEW—The Shock entered the 2002 WNBA season with a wealth of promising young talent due to holding five of the top 22 picks in the 2002 WNBA Draft...As a result, the Shock entered regular season play having the least experienced roster in the WNBA, averaging 1.45 years per player...The leader of the group was the second overall choice in the '02 WNBA Draft, former UCONN standout Swin Cash...Despite a strong draft, the Shock entered the franchise's fifth anniversary season thin at the point-guard position, and then received a difficult setback during the first week of training camp when projected starting point guard Dominique Carty broke her left hand...The team's early-season schedule would also show no mercy as Detroit played eight of its first 10 games on the road...The youngest team in the WNBA (23.7 years old average) struggled out of the gate, and an O-10 start (O-8 road, O-2 home) led to the dismissal of second year Head Coach Greg Williams...Palace Sports & Entertainment President Tom Wilson named former NBA Pistons' "Bad Boy" Bill Laimbeer head coach on June 19th, making him the third head coach in the franchise's five year history...The Shock extended the WNBA's 0003 second round pick...Powell's play in a Shock uniform (9.9 ppg, 4.2 rpg, 4.0 apg and 26.5 mpg in 15 games, 13 as a starter) sparked the team and solidified her as the team's point guard of the present and future...Cash would elevate her game after the Powell-Palmer trade, averaging 18.0 ppg, 8.3 rpg and 33.4 mpg (previously averaged 13.7 ppg, 5.8 rpg and 35.9 mpg) while leading the resurgent Shock to a 7-5 record over their next 12 contests (7/8 - 8/3)...Rookie forward Ayana Walker also emerged under Laimbeer, averaging 6.5 ppg, 4.8 rpg and 21.2 mpg (previously averaged 4.8 ppg, 2.9 rpg and 13.8 mpg) during the same 12 games...Down the stretch the Shock continued to impress, defeating each of the eventual four 2002 Eastern Conference playoff teams (New York, Charlotte, Washington and Indiana)...The Shock's 55-54 August 9th home finale victory over Indiana improved the team to 5-0 all-time in season home finales...Over the final 22 games, Laimbeer stressed an aggressive, attacking style of offense, and a physical, protect-the-paint style of defense...As a result, the Shock saw improvement in several key statistical categories...Detroit's rebounding per game average (36.4 from 27.8) and scoring average (66.8 from 64.4) shined the most under Laimbeer as he emphasized getting to the foul line and taking less three-pointers...The Shock finished as the second leading team in the league in rebounding percentage (52%, trailing only Los Angeles)...Overall, the team finished 9-13 (.409) after the early-season coaching change, and 9-23 (.281) on the season—the franchise's second consecutive eighth place finish in the parity-filled Eastern Conference...After a successful second half of play in which Laimbeer instilled a winning team attitude, the Shock franchise is poised to turn the corner in 2003...Detroit is anchored by star forward Swin Cash, and is supported by the steady play of point-guard Elaine Powell, athletic shooting-guard Deanna Nolan and a host of surrounding young talent...In addition, the Shock also has possession of two 2003 WNBA Draft lottery picks...Barring trade, Detroit will select twice within the top eight picks of next year's draft...The Shock is guaranteed to pick no worse than fourth and eighth in the 2003 WNBA Draft and has a forty-one percent chance to land the number one overall pick.

Bill Laimbeer named Head Coach/Director of Player Personnel...On June 16, Pamela McGee and Laurie Byrd named Assistant Coaches, replacing Greg Williams. **DRAFT PICKS** - Swin Cash, Connecticut (First Round, 2nd Overall), Lenae Williams, DePaul (Second Round, 18th Overall), Ayana Walker, Louisiana Tech (Second Round, 20th Overall), Jill Chapman, Indiana (Second Round, 21st Overall), Kathy Wambe, Belgium (Second Round, 22nd Overall) and Ericka Haney (Third Round, 47th Overall). **KEY TRANSACTIONS** - June 19, Relieved Head Coach Greg Williams of his duties and hired Bill Laimbeer as new Head Coach/Director of Player Personnel...July 7, Traded forward Wendy Palmer and a 2003 second round draft choice to Orlando for guard Elaine Powell and a 2003 first round draft choice.

BIG IMPROVEMENT UNDER LAIMBEER: Shock finished 9-13 under Laimbeer

The Shock finished the 2002 season by winning eight of their last sixteen games...Here is a look at some of the differences Head Coach Bill Laimbeer made after he took over on June 19:

- Pre-Laimbeer rebounds per game: 27.8; rebounds per game with Laimbeer: 36.4.
- Pre-Laimbeer points per game: 64.4; points per game with Laimbeer: 66.8.
- Detroit's three-point attempts went down (17.4 per game before Bill; 8.6 per game with Bill).
- The Shock went to the free throw line 22.2 times per game in their last 22 games compared to 16.3 times per game in their first 10 contests.
- Laimbeer's overall record was 9-13 after the team started 0-10.

Shock head coach Bill Laimbeer was 5-5 against non-playoff teams and was also 5-5 against teams below .500...He finished 3-8 against 2002 playoff teams and 3-8 against teams above .500...Prior to Laimbeer, nine of the Shock's first 10 games were against teams with .500 records or better at the time of the contest and eight of the first 10 were on the road...Under Laimbeer, the Shock took advantage of the fact that 14 of their last 22 games were played at home, in which their record was 9-13 (7-7 at home; 2-6 on the road)...Under Laimbeer, 11 of the Shock's final 22 games were against teams with .500 records or better at the time of the contest.

E.P. PHONE HOME: Elaine Powell just missed a triple-double at Charlotte on 7/27

Point guard Elaine Powell was three rebounds and two assists short of becoming just the third player in WNBA history to record a triple-double (Sheryl Swoopes, Houston, 14 points, 15 rebounds, 10 assists vs. Detroit on 7/27/99; Margo Dydek, Utah, 12 points, 11 rebounds, 10 blocks vs. Orlando on 6/7/01)...She played in 15 games with the Shock this season, 13 as a starter...She averaged 9.9 points, 4.2 rebounds, 4.0 assists, and shot 85.0% (34-40 FT) from the free throw line... Note: The team was 8-7 when she played and 7-6 when she started at point guard.

POWELL VS. PALMER: Comparing the July 7 trade

After the trade that sent forward Wendy Palmer to Orlando for point guard Elaine Powell, the Shock were 8-8 and the Miracle finished 7-10 and dropped out of the playoff picture...Powell averaged 9.9 points and 26.5 minutes per game in 15 games, 13 as a starter and Palmer averaged 11.3 points and 31.3 minutes per game in 16 games, all as a starter...Powell's combined record in games played with both teams during 2002 was 1-13 (.567) while Palmer's was 8-24 (.250).

JUST SWIN BABY: Rookie forward projects bright future for the Shock

- Scored in double-figures 15 of her last 16 games and in 28 of 32 overall.
- Led the team in scoring average (14.8 points, 13th in the league), minutes per game (33.7, 14th in the league) and rebounds (6.9, tied for 9th in the league).
- Second among rookies in scoring (Tamika Catchings, Indiana, 18.6).
- Scored a career-high 25 points at Utah on 7/8.
- Notched seven double-doubles on the year, good enough for sixth in the league and second among rookies.

GOING TO THE LINE: Shock forward led the league in free throws and free throw attempts

Rookie forward Swin Cash finished first in the league in free throws made (173) and first in the league in free throws attempted (227)...Orlando guard Shannon Johnson ended second in both categories with 164 makes and 214 attempts...Cash made more free throws than anyone else on the team attempted and went to the line 7.1 times per game...Note: 36.5% of Cash's points came from the free throw line.

CHA-CHING: Cash led the team in scoring 12 games in a row to break franchise record

Swin Cash led the Shock in scoring 12 straight games, from 7/8/02 at Utah (when she scored a career-high 25 points) to 8/4/02 vs. Phoenix...The streak marked a new all-time franchise record for most consecutive games leading the team in scoring...Korie Hlede did it seven times in a row in 1998 from 6/15 to 6/27...Cash led the Shock in scoring in 18 of the last 22 games and in 21 of 32 games overall (65.6%)...Here is a look at the top five players to lead their team in scoring on a game-by-game basis during the 2002 WNBA season:

SHOCK END ROAD WOES: Phoenix holds longest road losing streak of all-time at 21 games

Detroit's victory at Charlotte on 7/27 ended their 17-game road losing streak dating back to 7/24/01...At the time they were tied for the longest losing streak in WNBA history with Phoenix, who's streak dated back to 7/29/01...The Mercury won at Portland, 73-70, on 8/11 to end their streak at 21 games...Phoenix finished 1-15 away from home and Detroit ended 2-14 on the road.

RACKING UP THE REBOUNDS: Team owned the glass over the final 22 contests

The Shock grabbed a season-high 45 rebounds vs. Washington on 7/25...They hauled in 40 or more rebounds in eight of their last 22 contests...The mark had only been reached twice in Detroit's previous 42 games.

WITHOUT 3'S: Shock went 0-for-6 from beyond the arc on 7/25

Detroit failed to connect on a three-pointer for just the third time in franchise history during their 64-58 win over Washington on 7/25 at The Palace...The previous time was in Detroit's 66-63 victory over the New York Liberty on 7/10...The first time was also vs. New York on 6/7/00...The Shock connected on 49 three-pointers during their final 22 games; they made 61 in their first 10 contests.

SHOCK WAS ONE OF TWO UNDER .500 AT HOME:

14 of 16 WNBA teams finished .500 or better at home during 2002 season

The Detroit Shock and the Cleveland Rockers were the only two teams in the WNBA with sub-.500 records at home...The Shock finished 7-9 (.438) at The Palace while the Rockers posted a 4-12 (.250) mark at Gund Arena this year.

DOUBLE TROUBLE: Cash reached number three on Shock all-time double-double list

Swin Cash tallied her seventh double-double of the season and second in a row by recording 24 points and 14 rebounds at Cleveland on 8/3...Astou Ndiaye-Diatta just missed two in a row by scoring 10 points and pulling down nine boards at Charlotte on 7/27...[Stou had 12 points and 12 rebounds vs. Washington on 7/25]...Cash's double-double on 8/3 was the 48th in Shock history...Here is a look at the Shock all-time leaders:

TRIPLE-FORTY: Cash played all 40 minutes in regulation games three times in 2002

Rookie forward Swin Cash played all 40 minutes vs. Washington on 7/25...She also played all 40 minutes in games that ended in regulation at Phoenix on 6/13 and vs. New York on 6/9...The last Shock player to do this was Elena Tornikidou vs. Charlotte on 7/29/00...Cash is just the fifth player in Shock history to accomplish this feat...She also played a career-high 43 minutes in an overtime game at Minnesota on 7/1.

POUNDRING THE GLASS AT HOME: Shock out-rebounded opponents at home during 2002

Detroit averaged 35.3 boards per game to its opponents 29.3 in games at The Palace this season...On the road, however, The Shock and their opponents each pulled down 32.1 rebounds per game.

2001 Season in Review

2001 IN REVIEW – Change was the theme of the year for the Shock as the team entered the 2001 WNBA season with a new head coach, a reworked assistant coaching staff and five new faces on the regular season roster which included first round draft pick and Flint native Deanna Nolan ... The 2001 season also saw the return of Australian fan favorites Carla Boyd (Porter) and Rachael Sporn ... The young Shock opened the 2001 campaign at home versus the four-time defending champion Houston Comets and fell to the champs at the final buzzer, leading to an 0-3 start and setting the stage for a season of last minute, heartbreaking setbacks ... The Shock evened up its record at 3-3 while enjoying its longest winning streak of the season in knocking off undefeated Miami on the road, Washington at home and Charlotte on the road ... The Shock then suffered a season-turning setback when 2000 WNBA All-Star Wendy Palmer suffered a hamstring strain that would keep her on the shelf for 10 games ... Without one of the team's leading scorers, as well as additional injuries to Nolan and second round draft pick, guard Jae Kingi, the Shock lost eight of 10 and spiraled to 5-11 on the season ... Once healthy, the Shock embarked on a season-long four game west coast trip where despite playing excellent basketball, the Shock finished the trip 1-3 while being snake-bitten at both Seattle and Phoenix as the Shock led both by double-digits in second half play only to lose heartbreakers in the closing minutes ... Showing continued improvement, the Shock rebounded to finish the season strong, finishing 4-4 in its last eight, including 4-1 in its last five home games ... The Shock punctuated its late season success with an impressive season-finales home win over the eastern conference champion Cleveland Rockers to finish the season in a four-way tie with Seattle, Indiana and Washington at 10-22 ... The Shock lost seven games by just six points or less and went into overtime a franchise record five times (3-2) ... In addition to last-minute losses to Houston, Seattle and Phoenix, the Shock also lost heartbreakers to Los Angeles and Miami at The Palace, and on national television to defending eastern conference champion New York in the Garden.

2000 Season in Review



2000 IN REVIEW – Youth was the theme of the year for the Shock as seven different team members made WNBA debuts over the course of the season. Expansion and the 2000 Summer Olympics stripped the Shock of three regulars who started all or part of the 1999 season in Australians Sandy Brondello, Carla Porter and Rachel Sporn, leaving roster spots and playing time open for lesser experienced players. As a result, the Shock turned in inconsistent performances. On June 18, the team set a multitude of WNBA records, including most points in a game, in its 111-74 victory over Indiana. Detroit also forced league powers Los Angeles and Houston to the wire, missing a last-second shot to tie the game against LA and falling in overtime to Houston. But the Shock also dropped two games to expansion teams, losing at Miami on June 13 and at home to Portland on July 24. Despite the inconsistencies, Detroit entered the schedule's final day still alive for a playoff berth and defeated New York only to find out that Washington beat Cleveland to secure the Mystics' slot in the postseason, via better head-to-head record.

1999 Season in Review

1999 IN REVIEW- Key-player injuries and a blockbuster trade headlined a season in which the Shock became the first-ever expansion team to qualify for the WNBA Playoffs. Siting atop the Eastern Conference in first place (10-8) after a July 23 victory at Cleveland, the Shock lost trailing forward Rachael Sporn for the remainder of the season due to a torn ACL and MCL. The same night, three Shock players were suspended for one game each due to an altercation which took place with Cleveland forward Tracy Henderson, forward Dominique Canty, forward Astou Ndiaye and center Val Whiting. Six days later, Shock GM/Head Coach Nancy Lieberman-Cline pulled the trigger on the league's first-ever two-for-two trade. The big trade involved bringing forward Wendy Palmer, a 1998 ALL-WNBA Second Team Member and forward Olympia Scott-Richardson from Utah on July 29 in exchange for forward Cindy Brown and guard Korie Hiede. The Shock rallied to finish 5-4, including road victories at Los Angeles, at New York and at Charlotte before defeating the Orlando Miracle at The Palace on the last day of the regular season to qualify for the playoffs. The Shock earned the #2 seed in the Eastern Conference at 15-17 and were ousted 60-54 by the visiting Charlotte Sting in a one game playoff.

1998 Season in Review



1998 IN REVIEW: Palace Sports & Entertainment President Tom Wilson named Nancy Lieberman-Cline as the Shock franchise's first-ever general manager/head coach in January 1998. The hiring of Lieberman-Cline and the image of 351 aspiring women's basketball players showing up for the expansion Detroit Shock's open tryout May 1-2 created a lasting impression for The Palace's inaugural season in the WNBA. On June 13, 1998, the Shock made its debut before 15,574 fans at The Palace of Auburn Hills versus Charlotte as the Sting defeated the Shock 78-69. The Shock started the season 0-4, before recording the franchise's first-ever victory (70-57) at Washington against the expansion Mystics June 21. The Shock would then string a season high six game winning streak and despite being an expansion team, stayed in the play-off hunt throughout the season. The Shock suffered a setback late in the season as the team lost rookie guard Korie Hlede to a torn right ACL during the team's victory at Sacramento. Despite falling just short of a playoff bid, the Shock rallied to finish the season strong, ending the year one game out of the 1998 WNBA Playoffs. The Shock finished 17-13, (.567) the highest winning percentage by an expansion team in the history of the four major professional sports (WNBA/NBA, NFL, MLB, NHL).
