Sky Practice Facility: ATTACK Athletics



ATTACK Athletics is a \$15 million, state-of-the-art training facility that opened in August of 2007. The 60,000 square foot training center includes four WNBA regulation courts, a comprehensive weight room, rehabilitation clinic, training pool and locker rooms. The facility, built by Tim Grover, owner and CEO of ATTACK Athletics, focuses on training professional athletes as well as hosting various youth programs in conjunction with the City of Chicago, Chicago Park District and World Sport Chicago. ATTACK Training Center is located on the West Side of Chicago at 2641 W. Harrison St.

UIC pavilion

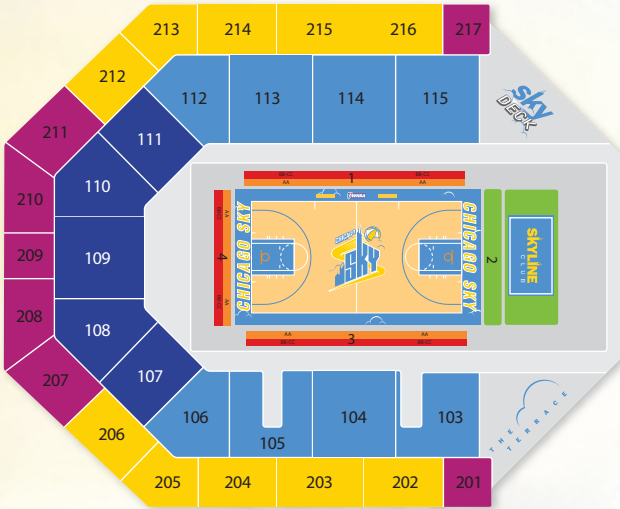
The UIC Pavilion was constructed in 1982 and renovated in 2001; it is home to the Chicago Sky, the UIC Flames men's and women's basketball and volleyball teams, as well as the Chicago Storm indoor soccer team.



Sporting events held at the Pavilion have included the AIBA World Boxing Championship, Volvo Grand Prix and Ameritech Cup tennis; USA Women's Basketball vs. the Russian Olympic Team, U.S. Precision Figure Skating Championships; men's and women's gymnastics competitions and the world-renowned Harlem Globetrotters. Past concerts held at the Pavilion include U2, Van Halen, Green Day and Madonna.

The largest university in the Chicago area, UIC has 25,000 students, 15 colleges, including the nation's largest medical school, and annual research expenditures

exceeding \$290 million. UIC's student body is recognized as one of the nation's most diverse, reflecting Chicago's global character, and an estimated one in ten Chicagoans with a college degree is a UIC alumnus.

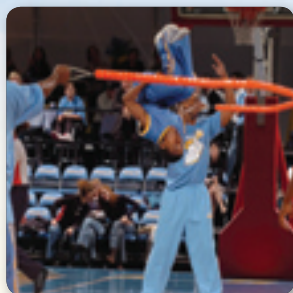


Sky Drumline, presented by Discover Card
