Paris sisters, WNBA president take part in weekend Tulsa events starting today

Former University of Oklahoma basketball players Courtney and Ashley Paris and WNBA President Donna Orender will be in Tulsa today representing the WNBA at the Tulsa Metro Chamber's Restaurant After Hours event at 5 p.m.

Restaurant After Hours is the Tulsa Metro Chamber's annual networking event where an expected attendance of approximately 700 Tulsa area business leaders will be on hand to sample dishes from more than 40 Tulsa restaurants. Admission for the event is \$15.

The WNBA will also have representatives present at the Rock 'N Rib Festival, including former Southeastern Oklahoma State University and WNBA star Crystal Robinson. Robinson will be conducting clinics for attendees throughout the weekend.

The Rock 'N Rib Festival, an event open to the public to celebrate the one-year anniversary of the BOK Center, takes place Sept. 17-20 from 11 a.m. to 12 a.m. Thursday-Saturday and 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. Sunday. Admission is free before 1 p.m. Thursday-Saturday and \$3 per adult all other hours.

Tulsa Mayor Kathy Taylor and WNBA Tulsa investor David Box were recently featured on an episode of "Sports Night Oklahoma" to talk about the future of a new WNBA franchise.

The pair were joined by Tulsa World reporter Lynn Jacobsen.

Box said that about 75 percent of the suites in the BOK Center were sold in anticipation of the team.

Taylor said that from talking to people around Tulsa, she has a sense that the desire for the team is there.

"I've gotten great response," Taylor said. "People are excited."

Jacobsen, too, sees the team's arrival as a positive.

"With the Houston team going out, it really created an opening here in the middle of the country that WNBA President Donna Orender wants to take advantage of and David Box and Bill Cameron should be commended for trying to bring it here," Jacobsen said.

Tulsa World poll: 70 percent favor arrival of WNBA team
