TRIPLE THREAT

Silver Stars rookie Megan Frazee is a triplet and played with her two sisters at Liberty University. She was recruited by assistant coach Olaf Lange, who spent two seasons at Liberty as the associate head coach prior to joining the Stars. Frazee joins a team that already has a triplet connection, as 8-year guard Helen Darling gave birth to triplets prior to the 2002 season.

MOVING ON UP

Becky Hammon and Vickie Johnson started the 2009 season by playing in their 263rd game together at Phoenix on June 6. With their game on June 23 against Phoenix, Becky and VJ moved up into a tie for second place with the duo of Yolanda Griffith and Ticha Penicheiro by playing their 265th game together. Three nights later, they stood alone at No. 2, playing their 266th game together at home against the Sacramento Monarchs. On July 12 the duo moved into a first-place tie with Lisa Leslie and Mwadi Mabika with 271 games played together. On Wednesday, July 15, in Washington, the pair stood alone as they played in their 272nd game together as teammates, a new WNBA record. If each of them plays all of the games from now until the end of the season, they will finish the regular season with 294 games played together.

LONGEVITY

Vickie Johnson has played more games than any other player during her 13-year career in the WNBA and is one of only three players in the WNBA that has played every season since the league's inception. Johnson played her 379th game when the Silver Stars opened to 2009 season in Phoenix on June 6 and is currently at 410 games played. The next-closest active player is the Mercury's Tangelia Smith, who has played 381 games during her 12-year career. Tina Thompson and Tamecka Dixon are the other two players who have played in every season since the WNBA played its first game in 1997. Thompson spent her first 12 seasons with the Houston Comets before signing with the L.A. Sparks as a free agent for the 2009 season. Thompson missed the first half of the 2005 season to give birth to her son. Dixon spent nine seasons with the L.A. Sparks, three with the Houston Comets, and is now playing with the Indiana Fever. Dixon also missed half of the 2007 season when she was waived by the Comets and then re-signed after clearing waivers. **Note – Lisa Leslie has been in the WNBA since 1997, but missed the entire 2007 season after giving birth to her first child.*

SWAN SONG

Vickie Johnson announced on Thursday, June 11, that 2009 will be her final WNBA season. Johnson played in the first game and grabbed the very first defensive rebound in WNBA history, starting at forward for the New York Liberty as they defeated the Los Angeles Sparks, 67-57, on June 21, 1997. Johnson played 28 minutes in the game, scoring 13 points. She led New York with eight rebounds (five offensive), then chipped in two assists and a steal. She has played in five WNBA Finals series, but has yet to claim a title. Some of her career highlights:

- Only player in WNBA history to score 4,000 (4,244) points, grab 1,500 (1,641) rebounds and dish out 1,000 (1,205) assists.
- WNBA all-time leader in games (410) and minutes played (12,434)
- Two-time WNBA All-Star (1999, 2001)
- Ranks 8th all-time in field goals made (1,625)
- Ranks 6th all-time in field goals attempted (3,768)
- Ranks 6th all-time in assists (1,205)
- Ranks 8th all-time in points scored (4,244)
- Winner of the 2008 Kim Perrot Sportsmanship Award

EAST vs. WEST

The San Antonio Silver Stars had won 15 consecutive games against Eastern Conference teams until their loss at New York on June 19 (61-77). You had to go all the way back to the 2007 season to find a loss against an East team. On Friday, August 17, 2007, the Silver Stars dropped a home contest, 55-59, to the Indiana Fever. Last season the Silver and Black went a perfect 14-0 during the regular season against Eastern Conference foes.

OFF TO A SLOW START

In 2009, the Silver Stars haven't been quite the sharp-shooters they've been in the past. San Antonio has shot over 35 percent from behind the arc over the past two seasons combined, ranking them among the league's best 3-point shooting teams. They finished the 2009 season ranked No. 8 in the league in 3-point shooting percentage, connecting on just 34.6 of their attempt from behind the arc.

2009 TEAM NOTES

IS THAT RIM SMALLER THAN NORMAL?

The Silver Stars led the WNBA in 2008 with a scorching .433 shooting percentage. That has fallen off a little in 2009 as the squad is ranked No. 8, hitting at a .427 clip. They have been out-shot in 21 of their 34 games this season, most recently on the road against Los Angeles on Sept. 8 when the Silver and Black connected on 44.6 percent of their field goals, but allowed the Sparks to connect on 50.0 percent of their attempts. The Silver Stars are just 7-14 this season when they are out-shot by their opponent.

RETURN TO SENDER

Ruth Riley recorded four blocks against the New York Liberty on Friday, June 19, 2009 in New York, bringing her career total to 401. She became just the fifth player in WNBA history to reach the 400-mark for her career. Ruth is currently seventh in the league in blocked shots per game, turning away 1.45 attempts per night for a season total of 45. She is currently at 438 and counting for her career. Indiana's Tammy Sutton-Brown joined the 400-Club the day after Riley and is currently sixth on the all-time list with 432.

CATCH THAT THIEF

Helen Darling picked up her 300th career steal on June 23 against the Phoenix Mercury. She is currently averaging 0.9 steals per game, which is just below her career average of 1.1 per game. Her best season was back in 2007, her first season in San Antonio. She pick-pocketed her opponents 45 times that season, an average of 1.4 per game.

ROCKY ROAD

The Silver Stars picked up their first road-win of the season on Friday, July 10, after starting the season 0-4 on the road. It has happened four other times in franchise history, in '98, '99, '03 and last season. It's still not the worst road start in franchise history though, as they went 0-6 back in 2005 before finally winning one in Charlotte.

ADDING TO HIS COACHING RESUME

On July 9, 2009, Silver Stars' head coach Dan Hughes was named the Western Conference head coach for the 2009 All-Star Game in Connecticut. This will be the first time Hughes has coached an All-Star team. Under WNBA guidelines, the coach of the previous season's conference champion serves as the All-Star coach for that conference.

OH WHAT A NIGHT

July 30, 2009, saw two Silver Stars players reach a career-high in points scored. Becky Hammon scored 38 points in the loss on the road in Sacramento. Her previous high-scoring game was 33 points at Minnesota on June 6, 2003. Sophia Young put up 29 points against Sacramento, edging out her previous career-high of 27 which she set back on July 1, 2008 in a matchup at the AT&T Center with the Detroit Shock.

A PHE-HAMMON-AL SEASON

Despite San Antonio's 15-19 record, Becky Hammon is having a career year in several statistical categories. At the end of the regular season, Hammon is averaging a career-high 19.5 points per game. It is the first time in her career that she has averaged 19 points or more per game this late in the season. The highest she ever finished was in her first season with the Silver and Black when she finished with 18.8 ppg. Her 19.5 currently ranks her No. 2 in the league, just behind the Mercury's Diana Taurasi (20.4ppg). Hammon is also averaging 3.3 rebounds per game and 1.6 steals per game. Her best rebounding season came in 2004 when she finished with 3.5 rpg, and her highest steals per game average came in 2005 when she finished with 1.8 spg. Finally, her move to San Antonio has helped her assist totals as well. The highest she ever finished in New York was 4.4 assists per game in 2004. Since joining the Silver Stars, Becky has averaged 5.0 apg (2007), 4.9 apg (2008), and is currently at a career-high-tying 5.0 apg at the end of the 2009 regular season.

SETTING A NEW STANDARD

In their game against the Phoenix Mercury on 8/15, the Silver Stars set a number of franchise records. Their 31 second-quarter points set the record for most points in the second quarter and contributed to a record 61 first-half points for the Silver and Black, setting a new mark for most points in any half for San Antonio. The 61 points also tied a WNBA record for most points in the first half, set by Seattle two seasons ago against Phoenix on Aug. 4, 2007. Their 25 first-half field goals and 17 assists eclipsed the previous records of 21 and 16, respectively. San Antonio put up 106 for the game, beating out the previous record of 104 points set back in 1999 when the team was still in Utah. It also ties the fourth highest point total by any team in the WNBA this season. Phoenix set a new WNBA record when they put up 115 points in an overtime win at home against Sacramento on June 13.

CAREER NIGHT

Sophia Young scored a career-high 31 points against the Los Angeles Sparks at home on Aug. 21. With the 31 points she also surpassed the 2,000-point mark for here career, bringing her total to 2,020. She is the third player from the 2006 Draft Class to reach the 2,000 point-mark for her career (Seimone Augustus, Minnesota, 2,230 points; Cappie Pondexter, Phoenix, 2,261 points). Candice Dupree of the Chicago Sky is not far behind with a career total of 1,880. (Note: Numbers as of Aug. 22)

2009 TEAM NOTES

NOT HER NIGHT

Becky Hammon went 0-5, including 0-4 from 3-point range, in San Antonio's visit to Indiana on 8/27. It was the 22nd time in her career that she was held scoreless, the last time coming exactly 4 years ago to the date, on Aug. 27, 2005, also at Indiana. She was a member of the New York Liberty at the time. In this last occurrence, Hammon played 32:01, the most minutes she's ever played in a game in which she was held scoreless.

ELITE COMPANY

Becky Hammon recorded six assists in San Antonio's visit to Indiana on Aug. 27, pushing her career total to 1,002 assists. She became just the seventh player in league history to break the 1,000 barrier in career assists. Two nights later at home against Detroit, Hammon scored 32 points, becoming the 11th player in league history to eclipse the 4,000-point mark for her career. She currently stands at 4,080 points and 1,032 assists for her career. There are only two players in league history that have accomplished both milestones, the other being fellow Silver Star Vickie Johnson (4,244 points and 1,205 assists).

30/30

Becky Hammon and Sophia Young both scored over 30 points at home against Detroit on Aug. 29. Hammon led the team with 32 points, picking up her 4,000th career point in the process, while Young tied her career-high with 31 points in the overtime victory. It marks the first time in franchise history where two Silver Stars scored 30+ points in the same game.

EXTRA FRAMES

The Silver Stars set a franchise record when they played their fourth overtime game of the season at home against the Detroit Shock on Aug. 29. They extended the record three nights later at home against Minnesota on Sept. 1, defeating the Lynx in a double-overtime thriller that had huge playoff implications. The Silver Stars are 2-3 in overtime games this season. The previous franchise record for overtime games in a season was three, which has occurred five separate times in franchise history, including two seasons in Utah. The WNBA record for overtime games in a season is seven and was set in 2001 by the Miami Sol and tied last season by the Los Angeles Sparks.

AFTERNOON DELIGHT

San Antonio has played a total of six day-games (3 p.m. local or earlier) this season, more than any other team in the league. The Connecticut Sun and the Washington Mystics have both played in five day-games this season. The Silver Stars are 4-2 in day-games this season.

EDY'S NIGHT

Edwige Lawson-Wade had a night to remember on Sept. 5 at home against the Los Angeles Sparks. She recorded her first career double-double, scoring 11 points and dishing out a career-high 11 assists. Her 11 assists are the most by any Silver Star this season. Lawson-Wade also pick-pocketed the Sparks five times, setting another career-high in the process. Finally, she led the Silver Stars with a career-high-tying five rebounds, tying the mark she set earlier in the season in Sacramento on July 30. It is the third time this season she has grabbed five rebounds in a game, the other coming in Minnesota on Aug. 9.

GOING OUT WITH A BANG

Since the beginning of September, Vickie Johnson has stepped up her game considerably. The Silver Stars honored the 13-year veteran on Sept. 1 before the game against Minnesota. Johnson proceeded to go out and score 17 points, only the fifth time this season she scored in double-figures. She also collected seven rebounds and dished out four assists in an important win for the Silver Stars in their race for one of the final two playoff spots in the Western Conference. On Saturday, Sept. 5, San Antonio hosted the Los Angeles Sparks in yet another game with huge playoff implications for both teams. It was WNBA Legend Lisa Leslie's last regular season visit to the Alamo City, but it was once again Johnson who stole the show. VJ led all scorers as she poured in a career-high-tying 27 points on 11-14 shooting, including 5-6 from 3-point range. In the month of September, she is averaging 13.5 points, 3.5 rebounds, and 2.5 assists. She entered the month averaging just 5.6 points per game this season.
