# Sparks Open at Home with 74-61 Win Over Storm

The Sparks knew that the Seattle Storm would come to STAPLES Center tonight with a vengeance after letting a 21 point advantage dwindle to a loss in the teams first meeting last Friday at KeyArena.

So the Sparks (2-0) decided to make a statement tonight in their home opener, leading by as many as 15 points in the second half before defeating the Storm (0-2) 74-61 for the second time.

But it was the Sparks defense that dictated the tempo of the game, forcing 19 Seattle turnovers (13 in the first half) that led to nearly a third of the Sparks total points.

Defensively, we were stingy, greedy, and all the things you should be on the defensive end, Sparks Head Coach Carol Ross said. We held them to 38 percent shooting and 61 points. That's how you find ways to win.

The Sparks got the memo early on, as active hands led to six steals in the first quarter alone. The team took advantage of easy layups in transition that allowed them to lead by as many as 11 points in the first half.

But Seattle carried with them a troubling statistic from last Friday's game: they were outscored by the Sparks 40-10 in the fourth quarter. Knowing they couldn't sit back and take a break during any quarter, the Storm went on a late second quarter 9-2 run, capped by back-to-back threes by Tina Thompson. Shooting 56 percent from beyond the arc, the Storm only trailed by four at the half (37-33).

Yet Sparks wouldn't let up either. The game-changer came in the final minutes of the third quarter when the Sparks went on a 9-0 surge, ignited by a jumper and free-throw by Alana Beard, followed by back-to-back threes by Kristi Toliver and Candace Parker. The big three put the Sparks up by 15 (60-45), their first substantial double-digit lead since early on.

Parker dominated with a game-high near triple-double with 21 points, 10 rebounds, and 6 blocks. Toliver continued to be a consistent threat from three-point range, hitting four threes en-route to 18 points and 4 assists. Beard chipped in with 13 points and 7 boards. Jantel Lavender provided key energy off the bench, scoring six points.

Eliminating any possibility of a late comeback for the Storm, a jumper by Beard extended the lead once again (62-47) within the opening seconds of the fourth quarter, forcing the Storm to call a timeout as the home crowd sensed their squad pulling away.

While point guard and cornerstone of the Storm offense Sue Bird struggled with just 5 points, the Storm relied on physical play inside instead. Wauters had 15 points and 8 rebounds, while Camille Little added 10 points. Outside shooters Tina Thompson and Katie Smith contributed 13 and 11 points respectively.

But to no avail, as the Sparks held on to pick up their second victory of the season.

I think that what is so special about this team is that we all have the same mindset. Parker said. We have the mentality that none of us have won a championship in the last decade.

The Sparks will use this mantra as fuel when facing the defending WNBA Champion Minnesota Lynx on the road, Thursday at 5:00 p.m. Pacific.

## MINNEAPOLIS -- Seimone Augustus has been on losing team after losing team since being the No. 1 overall pick in 2006 by the Minnesota Lynx.

The losing weighed on Minnesota's career leading scorer. Finally playoff bound, she felt quite a difference once the Lynx finally punched their long-awaited ticket to the postseason.

"The people that's been here and went through those rough stages, we feel real good about it," Augustus said. "It's just that weight, I feel lightheaded right now. I feel real light right now."

Augustus scored 17 points and the Lynx beat the Los Angeles Sparks 87-68 on Saturday night to earn their first playoff berth since 2004. Candice Wiggins added 13 points, including four 3-pointers for Minnesota (20-6), which tied a team record for wins in a season and entered the day leading the Western Conference by 4 1/2 games over second-place Phoenix. Monica Wright scored 11 points for the Lynx, who also own the WNBA's best record by two games over East-leading Indiana (18-8).

Minnesota isn't satisfied, yet.

The Lynx have their sights set on home-court advantage, which would come with finishing with the league's best record. "It was a long time coming and it's here," said Wiggins, who is in her fourth season for Minnesota. "Now it's like, 'Hey, who cares?' Now it's on to the next goal."

Candace Parker had 18 points and eight rebounds in her second start since returning from knee surgery for Los Angeles (10-15), which fell further behind fourth-place Seattle for the final playoff spot in the West.

Minnesota has only made two trips to the postseason since joining the league in 1999, and has never won a playoff series. No current member of the roster has been played a postseason game with the Lynx, who made the playoffs in 2003 and 2004.

Augustus has seen the worst of the playoff drought, but she never doubted she would eventually reach the postseason.

"I thought this day was going to come, it couldn't get no worse than where we were at," Augustus said. "I'm happy this day has finally arrived. We're happy about it. I know the fans are excited. Everybody's got, like, a weight lifted off our shoulders that we finally made it." Augustus helped break the Lynx out of a slump against the Sparks on Saturday.

With Parker back in the lineup, Los Angeles came out strong. Parker scored 10 of her team's first 15 points, hitting her first four shots. The Sparks took a 20-10 lead, but the Lynx countered with a 16-2 run to take a lead they wouldn't relinquish.

Augustus scored all eight of her first-half points in the second quarter, and Wiggins added all nine of her first-half points in the quarter as Minnesota added on to its lead.

"We had them on their heels," Parker said. "But we relaxed and they took over. We only showed glimpses of being a great team. We saw a little bit of adversity and laid down."

It's been a rough go for the Sparks without Parker, who missed seven weeks with a torn lateral meniscus. However, Los Angeles beat Indiana in Parker's first start since returning on Thursday, when she scored 18 points to go with five assists.

However, after two turnovers in the first quarter, Los Angeles finished with 17.

Parker also found the going a bit tougher. She scored just five points in the second half and finished 7 of 14 shooting.

"She had a couple of bunnies she missed that she doesn't miss if she's at full (strength)," Sparks coach Joe Bryant said. "She looked good, though. We'll take her at 80 percent."

Tina Thompson finished with 11 points for Los Angeles. However, Minnesota outrebounded the Sparks 43-24.

The 20 wins tie a season record for the Lynx and set a regular-season mark. Minnesota had 19 regular-season wins in 2003 and added one win in the playoffs against Los Angeles.

"There's a lot of history to be made here," Augustus said. "We still got some work to do."

## **New Coach, New Era**

---

Head Coach Carol Ross will be making her WNBA head coaching debut with the Sparks in 2012. Previous stops for the Ole Miss alumna include the head coach position at the University of Florida where she led the Lady Gators to 9 NCAA tournament appearances in 10 years while averaging 20 victories a season. Her 247-121 record is still the best for any women's head coach in school history. As head coach at Ole Miss, Ross guided the Lady Rebels to a 77-50 record while appearing in two NCAA tournaments from 2003-2007.

---

## **Drafting for the Future**

---

The Sparks used the first overall pick in the 2012 Draft to select Stanford stand-out Nneka Ogwumike. The forward averaged 22.5 points, 10.2 rebounds, 1.1 blocks, 1.7 assists and 1.3 steals per game in her senior season. She was named 2011-2012 PAC-12 Player of the Year, All-PAC-12 First Team, and PAC-12 Tournament MOP, while leading the conference in scoring, defensive rebounds and free-throw percentage. Ogwumike was a finalist for the Wade Trophy and Wooden Award in each of the last three seasons.

The Sparks Final Pick in the 2012 draft was used on Rutgers star, April Sykes. Sykes, a 6'0" combo guard/forward averaged 13 points, 5.5 rebounds, 1.4 assists and 1.1 steals per game. She was named All-Big East Second Team after tying for the lead in points for her Rutgers team with Rushdan.

All-Star Candace Parker will be reunited with her college teammate, Nicky Anosike, who was a free agent pick up over the off-season. The duo won back-to-back national titles at Tennessee.

Marissa Coleman and Kristi Toliver will be wearing the same jersey for the first time since their days at Maryland where they won the National Championship in 2006 and were both named All-Americans in their careers.

## **Last Time Out**

---

Last time out, The Sparks played a dominating game against the Seattle Storm at home. Candace Parker led the way with 21 points, 10 rebounds, and 6 blocks, while Kristi Toliver added another 18 points, shooting 4-5 from beyond the arch.

Carol Ross was named Los Angeles Sparks head coach on January 5, 2012, bringing over 25 years of coaching experience to the STAPLES Center sidelines.

Most recently, she spent three seasons as an assistant coach with the Atlanta Dream, WNBA Finalists in both 2010 and 2011. With Ross joining the staff in 2009, Atlanta enjoyed a 14-game turnaround from its inaugural WNBA season in 2008 and finished tied for second in the Eastern Conference. The Dream have posted 21-13 regular season records in each of the past two years, tying for first in 2011 en route to a second straight WNBA Finals appearance.

Prior to her tenure in Atlanta, Ross amassed a 324-161 (.668) record in 16 seasons as an NCAA Division I head coach in the highly-competitive Southeastern Conference, guiding her teams to 12 NCAA Tournaments and two WNIT appearances. Twelve of those seasons (1990-02) were spent at Florida – where she coached current Sparks forward DeLisha Milton-Jones – before returning to her alma mater Mississippi from 2003-07.

During her four-year run at Ole Miss, Ross compiled a 77-50 (.606) record and guided the Lady Rebels to two NCAA Tournaments and a pair of WNIT appearances. In Ross' first season, 2003-04, she led Mississippi back to the Big Dance for the first time since 1995-96 and earned SEC Co-Coach of the Year honors. In 2006-07, Ole Miss reached the 20-win plateau for the first time in more than a decade and advanced all the way to the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament.

Guard Arminite Price played four years under Ross with the Lady Rebels, earning AP All-American honors as a senior en route to being selected third overall in the 2007 WNBA Draft by Chicago. Price went on to claim WNBA Rookie of the Year accolades that season, and was reunited with Ross the past three years in Atlanta.

Ross also developed a reputation for developing WNBA talent at Florida, where she remains the winningest coach in school history with a 247-121 (.671) mark over 12 seasons and was a finalist for the Naismith National Coach of the Year in both 2001 and 2002. The Lady Gators – who had never received a bid to the NCAA Tournament before Ross' arrival in Gainesville – appeared in nine NCAA Tournaments over her last 10 years. Florida averaged over 20 victories per season during her 12-year tenure, and almost 23 wins over the last 10 years.

Arguably the Lady Gators' finest season was 1996-97, when they reached the Elite Eight of the Big Dance and star forward Milton-Jones won the Wade Trophy as the best player in the country. Florida achieved its first-ever top-10 national ranking in 1996-97, and finished among the nation's top-25 in seven of Ross' final nine seasons.

Three of the top-16 picks in the inaugural 1997 WNBA Draft came from Ross' Lady Gator program. Meanwhile UF's Murriel Page was the No. 3 overall pick in 1998 and Milton-Jones joined the Sparks in 1999 as the No. 4 overall selection. Milton-Jones – who credits Ross with greatly impacting her basketball development – is a two-time WNBA Champion with the Sparks, three-time WNBA All-Star selection and earned a pair of Olympic gold medals while representing the United States at the 2000 and 2008 Summer Olympics.

Meanwhile Page led the WNBA in field goal percentage in both 1999 and 2000 while playing for Washington, and then suited up for Los Angeles from 2006 to 2009. Other notables coached by Ross at Florida include Merlakia Jones – a two-time All-Star and 2001 All-WNBA First Team performer – former Phoenix Mercury player and assistant coach Bridget Pettis and former Sparks guard Sophia Witherspoon (2002-03). In total, 26 of Ross' former players and recruits continued their basketball careers at the professional level.

Also active in USA Basketball, Ross has served as an assistant coach with the 2005 Under-19 World Championship team that won the gold medal as well as head coach of the 1998 USA Women's Select Team that went 7-1.

Ross earned her bachelor's degree in Education from Ole Miss in 1982. Ross was a four-year starter for the Lady Rebels from 1978-81, when Ole Miss logged a 93-50 record. She became the fourth women's basketball player ever to be inducted into the University of Mississippi Athletic Hall of Fame when she was honored on Sept. 1, 2001.

After earning her degree, Ross served as a volunteer assistant at Belhaven College in Jackson, Miss., for one year before returning to the SEC as an assistant at Auburn from 1983-90. During that time she advanced from graduate assistant to top assistant and chief recruiter. She played a key role in the school's development and maturation into a perennial NCAA Tourney team.

The Oakland, Miss., native has served as a board member for both the American Cancer Society and the Coaches vs. Cancer organization, which honored her as its 2000 Coaches vs. Cancer Champion Award winner.

## ASSISTANT COACH SANDY BRONDELLO

---



Entering her second season on the Sparks' coaching staff is Sandy Brondello, who boasts 12 total years of WNBA experience as a player and coach and has also competed internationally at the highest levels.

Brondello came to Los Angeles after serving as the San Antonio Silver Stars' head coach in 2010, guiding them to a Western Conference Semifinal berth. Previously she served as an assistant in San Antonio for five years (2005-2009), helping the team earn its first Western Conference Championship and trip to the WNBA Finals in 2008.

A WNBA veteran, she played five seasons with the Seattle Storm (2003), Miami Sol (2001-02) and the Detroit Shock (1998-99), averaging 11.4 points and 2.3 assists in 155 career games. Brondello played in the inaugural WNBA All-Star Game in 1999, and ranks fourth in league history with her 41.0% career three-point percentage.

The native Australian played for the Australia National Team for 18 years and is a four-time Olympian. She is a two-time silver medalist (2000 and 2004) and took home a bronze medal at the 1996 Olympics in Atlanta. She also represented Australia at the 1988 Olympics, while in 1992 Brondello was named the Australian International Player of the Year. She helped Australia bring home the bronze medal from both the 1998 and 2002 FIBA World Championships and also competed at the 1994 and 1990 World Championships and the 1990 Goodwill Games.

Prior to playing in the WNBA, Brondello played in the Women's National Basketball League (WNBL) in Australia from 1986-96, earning league MVP acclaim in 1995. She also played in Germany for BTV Wuppertal from 1992-2002, helping the team win 10 German Cup Championships. In 1996, Brondello was named the European Cup MVP after leading Wuppertal to the European Cup title and earned three European Cup All-Star selections in 1994, 1996 and 1997.

Brondello earned a degree in teaching from the University of Western Sydney in 1990. She and her husband Olaf Lange – a veteran basketball coach who served alongside Brondello in San Antonio last season – have a four-year-old son, Brody Max Lange, and welcomed Jayda Grace Lange to their family on May 31, 2010.

---

## ASSISTANT COACH JIM LEWIS

---



Joining the Sparks in 2012 as an assistant coach is Jim Lewis, a veteran of the WNBA and collegiate ranks with over 40 years of bench experience.

Lewis comes to the Sparks from George Mason University, where he served as an assistant coach with the Patriots' women's basketball team in 2011-12. He previously led GMU for 14 seasons (1984-1997) and remains the winningest head coach in school history with 201 victories. While with the Patriots, Lewis also served as an assistant coach on four medal-winning USA Basketball teams in the mid-90's.

Lewis left George Mason to become the first head coach in Washington Mystics history, guiding the franchise during its inaugural WNBA campaign in 1998. He later served as an assistant with the Minnesota Lynx in 2006, and as the Indiana Fever's assistant coach/director of scouting from 2008-10. With Lewis on staff, Indiana captured the 2009 Eastern Conference title and reached the WNBA Finals. In Los Angeles, he's reunited with former Fever forward Ebony Hoffman.

Additional head coaching experience came at Fordham University (2001-06) and T.C. Williams High School (2007-08) in his hometown of Alexandria, Va. Prior to his most recent tenure at George Mason, Lewis served as an assistant coach at Georgia Tech in 2010-11, helping the Yellow Jackets reach the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

He began his coaching career as an assistant coach with men's programs at Tennessee State, Gannon College, Duke and Tulane before coaching the boy's team at South Lakes High School for three seasons. As a player, Lewis was a four-year letterwinner at West Virginia University – competing in two NCAA Tournaments and one NIT – and earning his Bachelor of Science degree in journalism in 1968.

Lewis and his wife Karen have two children, Jennifer and Christopher, who both reside in northern Virginia. Jennifer, a graduate of Columbia University, is a physical therapist and Christopher, who graduated from Harvard University and was a two-year letterwinner on the men's basketball team, is a political consultant.
