Swin Cash hit 4,000 points at San Antonio, Sept. 3 and finished the regular season with 4,032 ... she needs one more block to reach 200
Katie Smith passed 6,000 points vs. Chicago, Sept. 11 and finished the regular season with 6,015 points in her WNBA career ...
Sue Bird finished the regular season with 4,103 career points and 1,780 assists...she is the only WNBA player to have reached both 4,000 points and 1,700 assists.

Ashley Robinson finished the regular season with 415 career points, after passing the 400 threshold Aug. 23 versus San Antonio

Awards and Recognition

July 5, 2011: Swin Cash was named West Conference Player of the Week for the games played June 27-July 3, 2011. Cash posted a season-high 25 points and nine rebounds and was a perfect 12-for-12 at the free throw line in a 75-70 loss at Connecticut, July 1. She followed that with 19 points, seven boards and two assists to lead Seattle in a 73-63 victory at Washington. The two-game totals put her atop the Western Conference in scoring (22.0 ppg) and fourth in rebounding (8.0 rpg) for the week.

July 11, 2011: Sue Bird was named West Conference Player of the Week for the games played July 5-July 10, 2011. Bird scored a game-high 21 points on 7-of-9 from the field along with five assists in the team's 78-61 loss at Indiana, July 5. She followed that with 17 points en route to a 99-80 home victory over Los Angeles, July 9. For the week, Bird averaged 19 points and 6.5 assists per game.

August 8, 2011: The WNBA honored Swin Cash for her commitment to the community with its WNBA Care Community Assist Award for August. It was a busy month for Cash, highlighted by a two-day event that provided more than 45 underprivileged girls quality time with female leadership and mentoring. Cash partnered with the Boys and Girls Club of King County to provide the girls with speakers on topics such as nutrition, leadership and personal appearance. On Aug. 18, the girls were invited to a luncheon and were welcomed by Storm players; each girl received shopping tips and a \$200 gift card. As part of a back-to-school-theme three days later, the girls went on a scavenger hunt and received back packs, school supplies and a new pair of shoes from Nordstrom.

September 25, 2011: Katie Smith was named Western Conference Player of the Week for the games played Sept. 4- Sept. 11, 2011. Smith helped the Storm clinch the No. 2 seed in the Western Conference, leading Seattle to consecutive wins. Smith ranked third in the conference in scoring (21.5 ppg) and three-point field goal percentage (.714), and eighth in steals (1.5 spg).

In a 81-70 win over Chicago, Smith became the third WNBA player to score 6,000 points when she hit a three-pointer in the first quarter. Smith finished the game with 17 points to give her 6,015 for her career, which ranks third behind Tina Thompson and Lisa Leslie. Two nights earlier, the 13-year veteran scored 11 of her season-high 26 points in the third quarter to lead the Storm past Phoenix, 85-70, and clinch home-court advantage against the Mercury in the playoffs.

PHOENIX (AP) When the Phoenix Mercury gets their fast break offense going, they can be unbeatable, even against a team that has dominated them for three seasons. Candice Dupree scored a season-high 29 points and the Mercury beat the Seattle Storm 92-83 on Saturday night to even their Western Conference playoff series at a game apiece. "We kind of were reacting to them as opposed to dictating things," said Seattle's Sue Bird. "With a team like Phoenix, you can't do that, you really can't." Phoenix outshot, outrebounded and beat Seattle inside in recording just its second win in their last 12 games against the Storm dating to 2009. "Shot the ball better, up-tempo game is our game," Phoenix coach Corey Gaines said. "I guess if we walk the ball down the court and play their style, they are better at that than we are. Hopefully we are better at the up-tempo game than they are."

Diana Taurasi added 26 points for the Mercury. Game 3 is Monday in Seattle. "A lot of it was just being aggressive," said Dupree, who averaged 14.6 points a game during the regular season. "I think as a whole we were really passive up there in Seattle in the first game. This game we attacked a lot more." Bird had 17 points and four assists for the defending champion Storm, who had won their last eight postseason games. It was the most points given up by Seattle all season. "They set the tone early on," Bird said. "Obviously, we are a defensive-minded team and we were not just helping ourselves." Phoenix led by as many as 15 but Seattle ran off 10 straight points to get within five with 4:10 left. But it couldn't complete the comeback.

"Dupree really was comfortable out there tonight," Seattle coach Brian Agler said. "She played in her rhythm and did a lot of things she likes to do, whether she faces up (to the basket) and scores on turn-around jump shots or gets to the rim off drives or posts up on the block off a seal." Dupree made 12 of 14 shots as the Mercury consistently found her inside, taking the pressure off Taurasi, the league's leading scorer who missed eight of her first 10 shots, and Penny Taylor. The Mercury's second-leading scorer is nursing back spasms that kept her out of five the last six games of the regular season. Taylor finished with 12 points and played more than 30 minutes, as all the starters did on Saturday. "It was a game we needed to win," Taurasi said. "We had to come out with that urgency, with that effort."

Tanisha Wright sparked the late run with consecutive 3-pointers and a pair of free throws that trimmed the Mercury's lead to 81-76. She finished with 18 points and four rebounds despite being hampered by foul trouble for much of the night. Phoenix got layups from Taurasi and Dupree on the next two possessions to extend the lead and secure the win. "Tonight we were able to run the ball down their throats and wear them out," Dupree said. The Mercury shot 55 percent from the field and outrebounded the Storm 37-24. Phoenix also outscored Seattle in the lane 58-12. DeWanna Bonner added 13 points and 13 rebounds for Phoenix. Dupree was 12 of 14 from the field and grabbed seven boards. Seattle missed five of its first six shots and Phoenix built a nine-point lead in the first quarter, despite Taurasi missing eight of her 10 shots in the period. Katie Smith helped the Storm rally in the second quarter, making four straight 3-pointers to get Seattle within one with 4:24 to go. Smith finished with 14 points. Phoenix then forced turnovers on successive possessions and got the ball inside to Dupree for six points in a quick burst late in the first half. The Mercury led 51-40 at the break. Phoenix has not won in Seattle since Sept. 10, 2009.

POSTGAME NOTES (9/15/11; SEATTLE 80, PHOENIX 61)

- The Storm tied the franchise record for the playoffs with 13 three-pointers.
- The Phoenix Mercury staved off elimination in the 2011 WNBA Playoffs forcing Game 3 in the Western Conference Semifinals at Seattle Monday.
- The Mercury improved to 9-3 all-time in postseason series elimination games and 6-1 at home.
- The Mercury defeated the Storm for the second time in its last four meetings overall, following a stretch of nine straight regular season and postseason losses to Seattle.
- Phoenix snapped Seattle's eight-game postseason win streak, dating back to the 2010 playoffs when the Storm went 7-0 to win the championship.
- Diana Taurasi has lost just one postseason series in her championship-decorated career. Tonight she improved to 7-1 in elimination games in her career.
- The Mercury now travels to Seattle Monday for a decisive Game 3. Phoenix is 3-3 all-time in Game 3 situations and 1-2 on the road.
- To advance past the first round of the WNBA Playoffs for the fifth time in its last seven postseason appearances, Phoenix will have to win at Key Arena for the first time since Sept. 10, 2009.

SEATTLE (AP) Tanisha Wright and the Seattle Storm got their offense rolling and finally figured out a way to slow down high-scoring Diana Taurasi. Wright scored 21 points, and Camille Little had 17 points and 11 rebounds to lead the defending WNBA champion Storm over the Phoenix Mercury 80-61 on Thursday night in the opener of the Western Conference semifinals.

Lauren Jackson added 13 points, six rebounds and three blocks for Seattle, which led 69-42 after three quarters. Swin Cash added 10 points and 11 rebounds. Taurasi, who averaged 21.6 for Phoenix to lead the WNBA in scoring for the fourth straight year, had just 11 points. She shot 3 of 11 from the field, including 1 of 5 on 3-pointers. Penny Taylor scored 13, and DeWanna Bonner added 10 - all in the first half - to lead the Mercury.

Little and Cash scored six points apiece as Seattle outscored Phoenix 29-11 in the third quarter. The Storm used a 14-0 run over the final three minutes to take a 69-42 lead at the end of the period.

Taurasi was 0 of 5 from the field as the Mercury shot 4 of 22 (18.2 percent) in the third quarter. Seattle shot 9 of 17 (52.9 percent). Wright and Little both had 11 points, and Jackson added nine to help the Storm to a 40-31 halftime lead. Wright netted seven points during a 17-7 run to close the first half after Phoenix led 24-23 early in the second quarter. Bonner scored 10, including two 3-pointers, to help the Mercury tie it at 19 after one quarter. Seattle was 9 of 9 on free throws in the first half. Phoenix was 1 of 2.

The Storm won the season series 3-1, including an 85-70 victory last week to earn the No. 2 seed in the Western Conference.

Seattle has won 11 of 12 games against the Mercury, including a sweep in the West finals last year. The Storm improved to 16-2 at home this season.

POSTGAME NOTES (9/15/11; SEATTLE 80, PHOENIX 61)

- The Storm extended its playoff winning streak to eight games, including three in a row against Phoenix.
- The 19-point margin was the second largest in Storm playoff history. The Storm defeated Sacramento by 20 in the 2004 Western Conference Finals.
- Phoenix's 61 points were the team's fewest since scoring 55 vs. San Antonio on Aug. 28, 2008. The team's regular season low was 70 points.
- Camille Little had 17 points and 11 rebounds. The 11 boards tied her high for the regular season.
- With 10 points and 11 rebounds, Swin Cash also had a double-double.
- Tanisha Wright's 21 points were as many as she scored during the regular season.
- Krystal Thomas grabbed seven rebounds, the most in her WNBA career.
- Nakia Sanford (sore right knee) did not play. As a result, Candice Dupree started at center for the first time in 2011.
- The Storm's 49 rebounds were a team playoff record (previously 42).
- From the 6:03 mark of the third quarter to the 9:03 mark of the fourth, the Storm outscored Phoenix 20-2.
- The Storm led by as many as 29 points. The team's largest lead of the regular season was 28 points vs. Indiana on 6/17.
- The Mercury's 29.4 percent shooting was worse than the team's low during the regular season (31.1 percent).

POSTGAME NOTES (6/4/11; Seattle 78, Phoenix 71)

- The Storm extended its KeyArena winning streak to 18 games during the regular season.
- Seattle has defeated Phoenix six consecutive times in the regular season. The Mercury was the last road team to win at KeyArena on 9/10/09.
- Sue Bird (13 points, 10 assists) recorded her 19th career double-double.
- With 18 points, Camille Little led the Storm in scoring. She was the Storm's leading scorer just once in 2010.
- Lauren Jackson passed teammate Katie Smith during the game and now stands third in WNBA history in scoring with 5,772 career points.
- Diana Taurasi scored 11 of her 31 points in the fourth quarter.
- The Storm outscored Phoenix 13-8 in fast-break points.
- Seattle held a 19-4 advantage in bench scoring. Mercury reserves shot a combined 2-of-13 (15.4 percent) from the field.
- The Storm improved to 8-4 all time in both home openers and season openers, having won six in a row dating back to 2006.
- Phoenix dropped to 6-9 all-time in season-opening games.
- The attendance of 11,548 was the largest at KeyArena since May 17, 2008 vs. Chicago.

POSTGAME NOTES (7/26/11; PHOENIX 81, SEATTLE 79)

- The Mercury fell to 10-6 on the season and is now 1.5 games behind Minnesota (11-4 after tonight's win vs. Los Angeles) for first place in the Western Conference.
- Phoenix dropped its second consecutive game after winning its previous six straight and 10 of its previous 11. The two-game losing streak is the team's longest since starting the season 0-3.
- The Mercury lost its second straight home game, the longest home losing streak since the end of the 2010 season.
- Seattle extended its win streak over the Mercury to six games dating back to the start of the 2010 season (eight games counting the 2010 Western Conference Finals).
- The Storm improved to 6-5 without reigning MVP Lauren Jackson, who tonight missed her 11th game with a torn labrum in her left hip.

POSTGAME NOTES (8/16/11; PHOENIX 81, SEATTLE 79)

- The Phoenix Mercury improved to 14-10 on the season and is in sole possession of second place in the Western Conference following San Antonio's loss to Indiana tonight.
- The Mercury defeated the Seattle Storm for the first time since Sept. 9, 2009, snapping a seven-game regular season series losing streak. It was Phoenix's second-longest losing streak to a single opponent in franchise history.
- The Mercury has won three consecutive home games following a three-game home losing streak. It marks the team's second-longest home win streak of the season (five straight from June 19 to July 15).
- The Mercury improved to 3-1 (.750) in its last four games and 4-3 (.571) since its three-game losing streak.

POSTGAME NOTES (9/9/11; SEATTLE 85, PHOENIX 70)

- The Storm clinched the No. 2 seed in the Western Conference and will have home court advantage for the series with Phoenix. Game 1 will be Thursday at 7 p.m. at KeyArena.
- The Storm reached 20 wins for the fourth consecutive season. Only the Los Angeles Sparks (1998-2004) have had a streak so long in WNBA history.
- The Storm won the season series 3-1.
- Katie Smith scored a season-high 26 points. Smith's previous season high of 16 came at Phoenix on Aug. 16.
- Diana Taurasi's season-high 36 points were the most by an opponent this season, surpassing her 31 on June 4. No other player has scored more than 24. Taurasi has averaged 26.8 ppg against the Storm.
- With six first-half three-pointers, Taurasi tied the record for a half she previously shared with Sue Bird.
- Taurasi's 20 second-quarter points were tied for second most in WNBA history. She holds the quarter record with 22.
- 28 of Taurasi's 36 came in the first half. She shot 1-of-6 after halftime.
- Swin Cash had 14 rebounds, one shy of her career high; Camille Little's 11 rebounds were a season high.
- DeWanna Bonner grabbed a career-high 14 rebounds (previously 13, 3x).
- With 13 three-pointers, the Storm tied the most in franchise history in a regulation game. 54.2 percent accuracy was also a season high.
- The Mercury's 70 points tied a season low. Phoenix averaged 72.3 points in the four head-to-head meetings, as compared to 88.9 overall.

WNBA UNVEILS TOP 15 PLAYERS ALL-TIME: Three players on the Seattle Storm's 2011 roster were recognized among the WNBA's Top 15 Players in History, the league announced during halftime ceremonies at the 2011 All-Star Game presented by adidas in San Antonio, Texas., July 23. **Sue Bird, Lauren Jackson** and **Katie Smith** were among those honored as the list was unveiled. Former Storm players Yolanda Griffith and Sheryl Swoopes, who played for Seattle in 2008, were also included in the list that celebrated the WNBA's 15th season.

Los Angeles was the only other team with multiple current players represented as Tina Thompson and Ticha Penicheiro were recognized. ALL-STAR PRESENCE: The Seattle Storm All-Star tradition continued as veterans Sue Bird and Swin Cash were named to the starting five in fan balloting for the 2011 WNBA All-Star Game that was played July 23 in San Antonio. Storm Head Coach Brian Agler coached the Western Conference All-Star Team.

Cash earned MVP honors for the second consecutive All-Star Game, although it was the Eastern Conference that won the game, 118-113. Cash had a double-double, recording a game-high 21 points and 12 rebounds to earn the MVP nod.

The Storm has had at least two players voted as starters in every All-Star Game since 2005.

SHE'S BACK: All-Star center Lauren Jackson returned to action for the Storm at home against New York Aug. 20 after missing 20 games due to injury. It was an impressive return as Jackson scored a season-high 20 points and added seven rebounds to her impressive career board total (2,385).

Jackson underwent surgery June 30th to repair the labrum in her left hip. The surgery was performed by Dr. Marc J. Philippon at the Steadman Clinic in Vail, Colo. Dr. Philippon has previously performed surgery on former Seattle Sounder Freddie Ljungberg, Charlotte Bobcats guard Gerald Henderson, baseball player Alex Rodriguez and NHL star Mario Lemieux.

- Sue Bird scored her 4,000th career point Aug. 23 vs. San Antonio at the free throw line with 19.4 seconds left in the first quarter. Bird is the 16th player in WNBA history to reach 4,000 points and the first ever with 4,000 points and 1,500 assists.
- One of four UConn Huskies to go in the first six picks of the '02 draft. Only time four of the top six picks were from one college team, any draft, any sport.
- As a rookie, Sue Bird led the team in assists, steals, minutes played, games started, and free throw pct.

A DECADE OF EXCELLENCE: The 2011 season marks the 10th year in Seattle for point guard **Sue Bird**, who was selected by the Storm with the first overall pick in the 2002 Draft. During her tenure in Seattle she has led the team to WNBA titles in 2004 and 2010 while being named to four consecutive All-WNBA First Teams from 2002-05. Last season Bird became the second player in WNBA history to reach the 1,500 career-assist milestone.

The **July 9, 2011** game vs. Los Angeles marked Bird's 300th WNBA game. She became the sixth player in league history to play at least 300 games with the same team. Teammate Lauren Jackson's game at Tulsa, June 1, put her in the same club:

WNBA President Laurel Richie was on hand for the occasion and the President recognized the WNBA for its historic 15th season. Following the ceremony, the Storm players hosted a WNBA FIT clinic for local youth on the White House basketball court. The clinic was done in connection with Let'sMove!, First Lady Michelle Obama's national campaign to tackle childhood obesity.

WNBA.com GM Survey Predicts Seattle Storm will Win Second Consecutive Title: In the ninth annual WNBA.com survey released June 1, Seattle was the overwhelming favorite to repeat as champions in 2011 as league general managers weighed in with their predictions. Sue Bird earned the most votes as the best point guard for the fourth straight year while Lauren Jackson was tabbed as both the best center and power forward.

A FAMILIAR FACE: Katie Smith, in her 13th WNBA season, joined the Storm in May, 2011. A seasoned professional, Smith adds to Seattle's veteran roster while being reunited with a familiar coaching staff. Smith and Storm coach Brian Agler, both of whom are from Ohio, won a pair of titles with the Columbus Quest of the ABL in 1996-97 and 1997-98. She has played with Sue Bird and Swin Cash on the USA National Team, winning Olympic gold medals in 2000, 2004 and 2008. Smith also earned a WNBA title with Cash when the pair played for the Detroit Shock in 2006.

2010 RECORDS AND HIGHLIGHTS

- The Storm swept all three rounds of the playoffs, becoming the first team in WNBA history to go 7-0.
- The Storm (28-6, .824) surpassed the 2005 Seahawks (13-3, .813) for the best single-season win percentage in Seattle pro sports history. With playoffs included, the Storm was 35-6 (.853).
- The Storm went undefeated at home, becoming the first team in WNBA history to do so during both regular season and playoffs (previously, the 2000 Los Angeles Sparks went 16-0 at home during the regular season). The 17 regular-season home wins were also a league record. With the four home playoff games, the Storm finished 21-0 at KeyArena.
- The Storm won 28 games, tying the record for the most regular season wins in WNBA history (with the 2000 and 2001 L.A. Sparks, both 28-4).
- The Storm won 13 games in a row from June 18-July 30, the longest streak in team history and the third longest the WNBA has ever seen (Los Angeles, 18, June 26-Aug. 11, 2001; Houston, 15, June 27-July 30, 1998).
- The Storm started the season 20-2, equaling the WNBA record for the best start after 22 games (the 1998 Houston Comets started 25-2 and finished 27-3).
- The Storm reached the 20-win mark for the third consecutive season (2008, 2009, 2010), joining just four other franchises to have done that (Detroit, 2006-08; Houston, 1998-2000; Indiana, 2005-07; Los Angeles, 1999-2004).
- The Storm clinched the Western Conference title on July 27 after just 23 games.
- The Storm secured the league's best record on Aug. 10, clinching home court advantage for all playoff rounds.
- The Storm became the first team to go 7-0 in a season against a single opponent, doing so against both Los Angeles and Phoenix.
- The Storm swept Los Angeles and Phoenix 5-0, the first time the Storm has ever beaten an opponent five times in the same regular season. The Storm also swept San Antonio (4-0), going 14-0 against the three other Western Conference playoff teams.
- The Storm did not lose the season series to any opponent. Four Eastern Conference teams split with the Storm 1-1.
- The Storm beat Tulsa by 46 points, 111-65, on Aug. 7 to break the WNBA record for the largest margin of victory (previously 45 by Houston at Washington, 110-65, Aug. 17, 1998) and tie the team record for most points scored in a game.

Brian Agler

Head Coach and Director of Player Personnel

IT STARTS AT THE TOP: Head Coach Brian Agler reached a milestone coaching mark with a home victory over Chicago, Sept. 11, the final game of the 2011 regular season. It gave him 211 professional career victories, moving him into a tie with Van Chancellor on the all-time professional women's basketball list:

1. Van Chancellor, 211 (10 years, all WNBA)
2. **Brian Agler, 211 (72 ABL, 138 WNBA)**

Agler Bio:

The 2011 WNBA season marks Brian Agler's fourth campaign as the Seattle Storm head coach, and his seventh year as a head coach in the WNBA. Agler was introduced as the Storm's head coach on Jan. 8, 2008 and is the third coach in Storm history. He also assumed the role of Director of Player Personnel.

In 2010 the Storm captured the league's championship title, its second, with an impressive regular season record of 28-6 and an undefeated playoff record of 7-0. Additionally, Coach Agler was recognized as the WNBA's Coach of the Year.

Prior to joining the Storm in 2008, Agler was the head coach and general manager of the expansion team Minnesota Lynx from 1999-2002, where he compiled a 42-54 (.438) record. Before being named the first coach of the expansion Lynx, Agler served as the head coach of the Columbus Quest of the ABL from 1996-1999, compiling an 82-22 record. He led the Quest to back-to-back ABL championships in 1997 and 1998 and was named the ABL Coach of the Year for the 1996-97 season. Agler completed his third season as an assistant coach for the San Antonio Silver Stars in 2007. Prior to joining San Antonio, he served as assistant coach with the Phoenix Mercury and helped guide the team to a 17-17 record after the Mercury finished with an 8-26 record in 2003. Agler spent 15 seasons coaching among the college ranks, including 13 seasons as a head coach. He posted an impressive collegiate record of 248-135 (.648 winning percentage). From 1993-96 he served as the head women's basketball coach at Kansas State.

In 1988, Agler took over as the head women's coach at the University of Missouri-Kansas City. In five seasons at UMKC, Agler was 85-54 and took the Kangaroos from a 9-16 record in 1988-89 to four straight winning seasons with 17 or more victories. Under his direction, UMKC led the NCAA in scoring defense three consecutive seasons from 1990-93. In 1991, UMKC set an NCAA team record, allowing 51.8 points per game.

As the head women's basketball coach at Northeast Oklahoma A&M Junior College from 1984-88, Agler compiled a 124-42 record (.747 winning percentage). In 1985-86, NEO A&M was ranked second nationally and posted a 30-2 record.

Agler attended Wittenberg University in Springfield, Ohio, where he starred on the basketball team for four seasons. He led the Tigers to their only NCAA Division III Championship in basketball as a freshman. He started all 112 games during his college career, leaving the school as the all-time assist leader (481). Agler helped lead his team to a 91-21 record during his four years with the Tigers, and was named most valuable player in the Ohio Athletic Conference and first-team All-America as a senior. In 1995, he was inducted into the Wittenberg Hall of Honor.

In 1980, Agler graduated with a degree in special education and physical education. He received his master's degree in education from Pittsburg State University (Pittsburg, Kansas) in 1985. Agler and his wife Robin, have one son, Bryce, and one daughter, Taylor.
