NOTEWORTHY

GOING DEEP

Depth is expected to be a strength for Connecticut this season, and minutes logged through the first two games of the regular season would seem to reflect that. So far, only Tina Charles has averaged more than 30 minutes per game (30.5), and a total of eight Sun players have averaged more than 16 minutes. That does not include veteran guard Tan White, who has been sidelined since May 7th with a concussion. In the first two games of the season against New York, Charles and Asjha Jones were the only members of the Sun lineup to play at least 30 minutes.

WHERE DO YOU START?

In her third season, center Tina Charles continues to redefine WNBA rebounding standards. The fastest player in WNBA history to reach 400, 500, 600 and 700 rebounds, Charles needs just four rebounds tonight in her 71st game to become the fastest player to 800, edging out Yolanda Griffith (72 games). Charles will also be chasing Griffith to 900 (83 games) and 1,000 (92 games) rebounds. While piling up rebounds, Charles is also collecting double-doubles. She recorded one in each of the first two games of the season, and now has 47 for her career. The franchise record is 50 by Taj McWilliams-Franklin, who needed 241 games to rack up that total. Natalie Williams set the record for fastest to 50 double-doubles, accomplishing that in 91 games. Charles is already the owner of the top two single-season totals for rebounds (398 in 2010, 374 in 2011) and double-doubles (22 in 2010, 23 in 2011) in WNBA history.

MAKING THEM COUNT

Veteran guard and former Tennessee star Kara Lawson announced last week that she is donating 50 dollars for every three-pointer she makes this season to the Pat Summitt Foundation. The Connecticut Sun will match Lawson's donation at the end of the season. Summitt revealed she was diagnosed with early-onset dementia, Alzheimer's type last August. Lawson is one of the top three-point shooters in WNBA history. She had 55 makes last year, and is 3 of 7 so far in 2012.

WEEK OF SERVICE

Connecticut Sun players, coaches and front office were at the New London Community Meal Center Wednesday night, serving food to the needy. About 200 people were fed over the course of one hour. Mohegan Sun donated the food, including turkey, stuffing, mashed potatoes, vegetables and dessert. Connecticut Sun fans also donated generously during the Food Drive on May 20th. All of those donations were delivered to the meal center the day before the player appearance.

EARLY EXAMS

After a preseason in which it allowed three teams to shoot a combined 47 percent while averaging 83.7 points per game, the Sun limited New York to 40.7 percent shooting and 75 points per game in consecutive meetings on May 19 and 20. San Antonio figures to present another defensive challenge tonight after shooting 55.4 percent while scoring 88 points in its opener against Tulsa. Following the Silver Stars is Minnesota, one of the more potent offensive teams in the league. The Lynx have averaged 92.5 points per game, and they are shooting 54.7 percent from the field through two games.

RAGGED OPENING

The Sun began their home opener Sunday by missing their first five shots while falling behind 8-0 to the Liberty. Connecticut shot just 3 of 18 for the quarter, with Asjha Jones accounting for all of Connecticut's made field goals. The Sun shot 28 of 51 (55.4 percent) the rest of the night, however, and a 23-5 run over a span of just over six minutes beginning with 7:11 remaining in the game sealed the win.

TWIN TWENTIES

Tina Charles (25 points) and Asjha Jones (20 points) combined for 19 of Connecticut's 31 field goals and 19 of 34 rebounds in Sunday's win over the Liberty. Interestingly enough, it was just the third time the two players have scored 20 or more points in the same game since Charles arrived as a rookie in 2010. It was the 21st time Charles has scored at least 20 points in a game with the Sun.

LENDING ASSISTANCE

Sun veteran guard Kara Lawson has 10 assists through two games while Renee Montgomery has nine. That is 56 percent of the Sun assists (34) so far in 2012. Montgomery had a career-high 167 assists last year to lead the team. She combined with Lawson for a total of 263 assists, 45 percent of Connecticut's 583.

HIGHTOWER STEPS UP

Third-year guard Allison Hightower followed up on her strong preseason performance by setting career-highs in points and made field goals in New York on May 19. Hightower finished the game with 13 points and five made field goals, including two three-pointers while also contributing significantly on the defensive end.

STREAKING ALONG

Sun center Tina Charles scored in double-figures for the second straight game Sunday, extending a streak that began with 16 points on August 13, 2011 against Washington to 14 games. The franchise record for consecutive double-figure scoring games is 18, set by Asjha Jones from June 16, 2009-August 9, 2009.



HOMING IN

With seven of its first nine games at home, Connecticut has a chance to get out to a quick start this year. The Sun established a franchise record with a 15-2 mark at Mohegan Sun Arena in 2011. Of course, there is a price to pay. During a 20-day stretch that begins August 28th, the Sun play seven of nine games on the road. That includes a West Coast swing through Phoenix (9/12), Los Angeles (9/14) and Seattle (9/16) before the team returns home to close out the season with Indiana (9/19) and Atlanta (9/23).

SWEEPING UP

Connecticut swept a back-to-back for the first time since August 28-29 of 2008, when it won at Indiana and Atlanta. In the process, it also jumped out to a 2-0 start for the first time since 2008, when it opened the season with a back-to-back sweep of Atlanta and New York.

DOUBLE VISION

This is the third time in franchise history that the Sun have opened the season with a back-to-back, and it is also the first time that Connecticut has faced the same team during a back-to-back. In 2008, the Sun opened the season against Atlanta and then traveled to New York the following day. The same thing occurred in 2005, this time with both games on the road in Detroit and Washington. Saturday's game marked the first time that Connecticut has won the front end of a back-to-back since defeating Seattle at home on August 13, 2009.

TURNING IT AROUND ON THE ROAD

Saturday's victory in New York was not only a good way to start the season, it was a good omen for a team that struggled away from Mohegan Sun Arena in 2011. Saturday's win was only the third time that Connecticut had won in New York since the beginning of the 2009 season and the team was 3-5 in both Madison Square Garden and the Prudential Center during that stretch. The Sun finished 2011 with a road record of 6-11.

GROWING UP TOGETHER

During the 2010 WNBA Draft, the Sun selected Tina Charles with the top pick, Kelsey Griffin at No. 3, Danielle McCray at No. 7 and Allison Hightower at No. 15. Since 2010, this group has combined with Kara Lawson, Renee Montgomery, Tan White and Asjha Jones to form the core of the Sun. On Saturday, Charles, McCray and Hightower all made key contributions to the victory. Charles led all players with 19 points and 13 rebounds, while Hightower had a career-best 13 points on five made field goals. McCray scored 10 points, including six in the second half, and grabbed six rebounds.

CRASHING THE GLASS

As Tina Charles begins her third season in the WNBA, now might be a good time to put her rebounding accomplishments during her first two seasons in perspective:

Consider these statistics:

- The fastest player in league history to reach 400, 500, 600 and 700 career rebounds, Charles needs 15 in the next two games to reach 800 ahead of Yolanda Griffith, who did it in 72 games. Griffith also set the mark for fastest to 900 (83 games) and 1,000 (92 games) rebounds.
- Charles has the two highest single-season rebounding totals in league history (398 in 2010 and 374 in 2011). Prior to Charles, the record was 363 by Cheryl Ford.

HONORING HISTORY

Sunday's home opener will be highlighted by the unfurling of a banner celebrating the 10th Anniversary of the Connecticut Sun. The banner, which honors players who have made a significant contribution to the franchise since it relocated to Connecticut, will be unfurled at halftime. The first two honorees are Nykesha Sales and Margo Dydek. These numbers are not retired.

MAKING THE CUT

Rookie center Chay Shegog survived the final cut earlier this week, earning a spot on the team after a solid preseason in which she made 5 of 11 shots from the field while also collecting 13 rebounds in 57 minutes. Selected with the 21st overall pick in the WNBA Draft back on April 16th, the 6-foot-5 center gives the Sun a solid backup to Tina Charles. Veteran Sidney Spencer and free agent rookie Dawn Evans were the final two players cut from the squad.

LAWSON LIGHTS IT UP

Veteran guard Kara Lawson came out firing in the preseason, making 12 of 23 field goals, including a team high five threes while averaging 13.7 points per game in the preseason. She led the team in scoring, assists and made threes. Lawson had 19 points in 22 minutes against the Lynx on May 10th, making 3 of 4 from three-point range.



TURN BACK THE CLOCK

Sun veteran Asjha Jones – 17 of 26 (.654) from the field in the preseason – seems to be getting better with each passing year. The 31-year-old forward had 12 points and eight rebounds last night in New York, and she even collected three assists in the fourth quarter. Last year, Jones set single-season personal records for total rebounds (217), defensive rebounds (153) and double-doubles (7). She is within 397 points of 4,000 for her career, which began with two seasons in Washington, and she is closing in on the top spot in some career franchise categories. She needs 26 games to move past Taj McWilliams-Franklin (243) into second place all-time in games played, and 368 points to pass McWilliams-Franklin (3,019) in points scored. Jones is tops in both categories with 278 games and 3,955 points.

OFFENSIVE DISPLAYS

Although it is always difficult to gauge results in the preseason, Connecticut showed indications it has the potential to rack up points this season. The Sun averaged 81.7 points in three preseason games without playing Tina Charles, who was rested. The Sun averaged just over 30 made field goals and 81.7 points per game, shooting .446 from the field. Nine players are back from the Sun team that ranked fourth in scoring average at 80.1 points per game in 2011.

STEALING POSSESSIONS

When veteran forward Mistie Mims was signed back in February, it was expected she would make an impact as an offensive rebounder, keeping possessions alive. The 6-3 forward has shown that ability throughout her career, and she finished with a team-high seven offensive rebounds during the preseason. Mims' versatility gives the Sun a complementary post player who can share the floor with both Tina Charles or Asjha Jones.

PLAYING TO HER STRENGTH

During this past offseason, third-year forward Kelsey Griffin committed to adding muscle without necessarily bulking up. The plan was to get stronger without losing foot speed. The results were evident in the preseason as Griffin led the team with 16 rebounds while also collecting a team-high 10 steals. Griffin has repeatedly stepped into passing lanes on the perimeter, either deflecting or stealing balls from the opposition.

ROUGH AND TUMBLE

Sun guard Tan White was knocked out of the preseason opener on May 7th after banging her head during a collision with a New York player in the 96-81 victory over the Liberty at Mohegan Sun Arena. She has been sidelined since that game with a concussion. Her condition is being continuously evaluated.

SCHOOL OF THOUGHT

Sun center Tina Charles is standing tall in places other than the basketball court these days. During the offseason, Charles made a donation of \$32,000 to OmniPeace. That sum covered the entire cost for a new school in Mali, Africa. The actual construction was done by Connecticut-based buildOn. The school, which features three class rooms that can support up to 150 elementary school children, is located in the village of Ganale.

SPEAKING HER PIECE

Point guard Renee Montgomery is a National Spokesperson and "Guardian of Dreams" for the Pajama Program. In her role, Montgomery will work on national initiatives designed to help children in unsettled and vulnerable circumstances feel safe. The program delivers warm sleepwear and nurturing books to children in need.

REMEMBERING THE PAST

As part of a season-long celebration of its 10th anniversary, the Connecticut Sun is asking fans to help pick an All-Decade team. Any of the 55 players who have competed in a regular season game for the Connecticut Sun since the team relocated from Orlando prior to the 2003 season is eligible to be chosen. Fans can visit www.wnba.com/sun/alldecade.html, where they will be asked to select the 10 players they feel have made the biggest impact on the Connecticut Sun since 2003. Voting will close on August 31st. On September 7th, during the home game against the Phoenix Mercury, the first two members of the All Decade team will be revealed. Three more players will be named during the September 9th home game against the Chicago Sky. The top five players on the All Decade team will be revealed on September 19th during the game against Indiana.

BACK TO SCHOOL

The Connecticut Sun recently announced it will donate \$20,000 over the next two years to Goodwin College, establishing the Connecticut Sun Foundation Scholarship to support adult students returning to school to complete a degree. The donation will support a total of eight deserving adult students with awards of \$2,500 each for the next two years. The median age for Goodwin College students is 28 years old. The College specializes in offering educational opportunities to non-traditional students with flexible programming that makes it convenient for working adults to attend classes.



QUOTABLES

CONNECTICUT SUN VS. NEW YORK LIBERTY - MAY 20, 2012

SUN COACH MIKE THIBAUT

On the fact that New York was not whistled for a foul in the third quarter after drawing 16 foul calls in the first half:

"In the second half, in all fairness, there were only two fouls called total in the third quarter. I think both teams cleaned up their game a little bit too. I think when you're tired at the start of the game, there's a lot more reaching and grabbing. In the second half, people got down in better stances on both teams and played. We also were crisper. We moved the ball better. We shot (58.3) percent in the second half and we moved the basketball. I think everybody early in the year is trying to figure out their team and how the game gets called. You get used to it. You just have to deal with it and figure it out as you go."

On Danielle McCray:

"She's been really good. She's had a really good training camp after the first week. Just took her awhile to get going. Our players like that are making it tough for me to make choices about who plays at what time."

On the ability to play through being tired on the back end of a back-to-back:

"I think sometimes, if you're in good shape, you kind of get your legs going and get your second wind. And the other part of it is, because we are deep, we can play a lot of people. We played two people at 30 minutes, but we had a bunch of people in the 20s and another one in the teens. You can play eight or nine people and not drop off and I think that helps your energy. We can rest people."

Was this a good time to catch New York because they are still coming together:

"I don't know. We didn't have Tina the entire training camp basically. We haven't had Tan (White) for two weeks so I think everybody goes through those issues. I don't know if there is a good time to get somebody or not. I think they're a good test for us because they are physical and smart defensively and they force you to work. I thought we did a good job adjusting, way better than we did early in the year last year against teams like this."

TINA CHARLES

On having to play more minutes

"When we have a team like this and a group of girls that believe in you and give you confidence, especially with the coaching staff, it makes it easier, on me and Asjha especially."

On defending Kara Braxton

"It's very difficult. She uses her body really well and she doesn't rush and she knows what she wants to do down there. It's really difficult. Every team you play against has well-respected post players in this league. There's no nights off."

RENEE MONTGOMERY

On adjusting to playing more than in college

"I think my rookie season I was forced to adjust. You don't have a lot of choices. If you don't adjust you're going to be on the bench so we kind of have to adapt but it's more mentally tough if anything where night in and night out you have to grind it out. It takes more mental capacity than physical actually, so it's really getting your mindset ready enough to be focused. I think it's a good thing we went where we went (to UConn) because even if we weren't playing a big team, we still prepared as if we were. In college they didn't allow us to be like 'Oh this is an easy team we're just going to run over them,' so adjusting my rookie year wasn't very hard."

On a letter grade for the first two games

"I would give us a C+. We have a lot of improvements we have to make. Our offense is still stuck at times; our defense is still stuck at times. We started both games kind of slow. I just like the way we played hard, that's why I gave us the 'plus.'"

ASJHA JONES

On the team adjusting to bad spells

"I think you're always going to have a bad spell. There's a lot of talent on every team you play against, so there will be times where you're struggling and I think right now we're doing a good job of not letting that get to us and just sticking with it and picking up on defense."

HEAD COACH MIKE THIBAULT (183-125)

Named head coach of the Connecticut Sun on March 7, 2003 following a four-year stint as an assistant with the Milwaukee Bucks, Mike Thibault is currently the longest-tenured coach in the WNBA. Beginning his 10th season, he has more wins than any active coach, compiling an overall record of 183-125 with a .591 winning percentage. A two-time WNBA Coach of the Year, he stands second in career wins behind former Houston Comets coach Van Chancellor (211), and will tie Chancellor's league record for consecutive years of service with the same team this summer.

Thibault needs 19 wins to become just the second coach in WNBA history to reach 200. In 2007, he became the third fastest coach in league history to reach 100 wins, achieving that milestone in just 159 games, on July 22nd. He is the fourth WNBA head coach to work at least 300 regular season games. From 2003 through 2008, Connecticut won 127 regular season games, tied with Detroit for the most victories in that six-year span. Connecticut and Sacramento were the only teams to have six straight winning seasons during that time while Connecticut, Sacramento and Detroit were the only teams to reach every postseason. Connecticut's 26-8 records in 2005 and 2006 are still the two best marks ever posted by Eastern Conference teams.

In 2011, Thibault led Connecticut to the playoffs for the seventh time in nine seasons, guiding the Sun to a 21-13 record. That was tied for the best mark in the Eastern Conference. The Sun also set a new franchise record for regular season home wins, posting a 15-2 mark at Mohegan Sun Arena, including a 7-0 start at home. The Sun are 40-11 over the last three years in their building. Statistically, the Sun averaged 80.1 points per game, narrowly missing the franchise scoring record of 81.0 set in 2010. Connecticut also set a new team record for three-point shooting percentage (.363) while surpassing 200 made threes for the fourth straight year. Second-year center Tina Charles set a new franchise scoring record, averaging 17.6 points per game on the way to her second straight All Star game while third-year point guard Renee Montgomery earned her first All Star appearance.

In 2010, the Sun finished 17-17, narrowly missing the playoffs. Charles earned Rookie of the Year honors while Kelsey Griffin was named to the All Rookie Team, but Connecticut's momentum was disrupted when starting guard Anete Jekabsons-Zogota missed 15 games with a knee injury. Star forward Asjha Jones also got off to a slow start, missing the first four games of the season while recovering from ankle surgery. Following a disappointing 2009 season in which the Sun missed the playoffs for the first time in seven years with a 16-18 record, Thibault overhauled his roster. He started by selecting veteran forward DeMya Walker in the Sacramento Monarchs dispersal draft, then signed free agent guard Kara Lawson. That was followed by a blockbuster trade that sent point guard Lindsay Whalen and the No. 2 pick in the 2010 WNBA Draft to Minnesota in exchange for second-year guard Renee Montgomery and the No. 1 pick in 2010. The Sun used the No. 1 pick to select Charles, and also executed a draft day swap with Minnesota that netted Griffin with the No. 3 pick in the draft. The selection of Kansas star Danielle McCray with the No. 7 pick in the first round completed a memorable day that instantly transformed the Sun lineup.

Trading Whalen was a typically bold move for Thibault. Thirteen of the 15 trades in franchise history have been made during his tenure, including the deal that originally enabled the Sun to draft Whalen with the fourth overall pick in the 2004 WNBA Draft. Asjha Jones and Margo Dydek are other notable players brought to Connecticut through trades. Named WNBA Coach of the Year for the second time in his career in 2008, Thibault led the third-youngest team in the league to 21 victories, a sixth straight winning season and a sixth straight berth in the playoffs. Connecticut's youth, combined with the offseason departure of veteran All Stars Katie Douglas, Nykeshia Sales and Margo Dydek led to predictions the Sun would struggle in 2008. Instead, the team jumped out to an 8-1 start, matching its best record over the first nine games of a season in franchise history. Connecticut was the last team in the league to lose on the road, the last to lose two games in a row, and the first to qualify for the playoffs, earning a spot in the postseason with a win at Atlanta on August 29th.

Despite starting two rookies in 28 of 34 games in 2008, the Sun established what were then records for total points (2,690), scoring average (79.1 ppg.), made threes (221) and three-point shooting percentage (.33.0). Eleven different players, including five rookies, started at least one game for the Sun in 2008. A total of 14 players – Connecticut added Erin Phillips and Svetlana Abrosimova to the roster following the Olympic break – logged minutes. Thibault's accomplishments were particularly impressive considering he was in the midst of completing a commitment to USA Basketball that began in February of 2006, when he was named an assistant coach on the staff of Anne Donovan. Thibault helped the USA Women's Basketball team win the bronze medal at the World Championships in Sao Paulo, Brazil in September of 2007, and the gold medal at the Summer Olympic Games in Beijing in August of 2008.

In 2007, Connecticut battled through an uncharacteristically streaky season that included a stretch of eight losses in nine games followed by 10 wins in 11 games. The Sun bounced back from a 6-11 start to finish 18-16 before dropping a thrilling three-game playoff series to the Indiana Fever.

In 2006, Thibault earned his first Coach of the Year Award after leading Connecticut to its second straight 26-8 season, its third straight Eastern Conference regular season title and its fourth straight trip to the Eastern Conference Finals. During the 2005 and 2006 seasons, Connecticut was 52-16 (.764) in the regular season. Only Los Angeles and Houston have ever won more games in consecutive seasons. The Sun won 12 straight games from July 16-August 9 of 2006, the third longest winning streak in league history. Ten of those wins came without Nykeshia Sales, who was out with an Achilles tendon injury. The Sun were 11-1 overall without Sales, and also went 2-0 without Taj McWilliams-Franklin.

In 2005, Thibault guided the Sun to a 26-8 mark that included a remarkable 13-1 record against the Western Conference. Connecticut's 12-2 start over 14 games was one of the quickest in WNBA history, topped only by Houston's 13-1 start in 1998. The Sun clinched their second straight Eastern Conference regular season title with five games remaining on their schedule. Not since 2001 had a team won as many regular season games as Connecticut did in 2005. Connecticut went on to repeat as Eastern Conference Champions, sweeping Detroit and Indiana before falling to Sacramento in the WNBA Finals, the first playoff series in league history played under a best-of-five format.

In 2004, Thibault led a Sun team that was a near-unanimous preseason pick to finish last to within one made basket of a WNBA championship. After finishing first in the Eastern Conference during the regular season for the first time in franchise history, the Sun beat Washington and New York for their first Eastern Conference Championship. Connecticut won the first game of the WNBA Championship series with Seattle before eventually falling in three games. Connecticut's 2004 run was surprising to some because Thibault had rebuilt the team following a 2003 run to the Eastern Conference Finals. Concluding the Sun needed to get younger and more athletic, Thibault carried five rookies on the 2004 roster, lowering the average age of his team from 28.4 to 24.2. Among those rookies was Whalen, who averaged more than 30 minutes per game as the starting point guard.

The Sun also excelled despite losing starting forward Brooke Wyckoff to a season-ending knee injury on May 3, 2004. Wyckoff and the five other veterans who did not return to the team averaged a combined 30 points, 13.5 rebounds and 7.6 assists per game in 2003. In 2003, Thibault inherited a squad that had never finished above .500. He guided his first team to an 18-16 record and the first playoff series win in franchise history, a sweep of the favored Charlotte Sting.

Thibault entered the NBA ranks in 1978 as a scout for the Los Angeles Lakers, and was promoted to director of scouting and assistant coach in 1980. The Lakers won two World Championships (1980, 1982) during his tenure. From 1982-1986, he was an assistant coach and director of scouting for the Chicago Bulls during a period when the franchise drafted Michael Jordan and Charles Oakley, while also acquiring John Paxson. From 1987-88 Thibault was the general manager and head coach of the Calgary 88's of the World Basketball League (WBL), earning WBL Coach of the Year honors in 1988.

In 1989, Thibault began a remarkable eight-year run as general manager and head coach of CBA's Omaha Racers. The Racers made the playoffs each season (1989-97) under his watch, bringing home a CBA title in 1993, and a return to the finals in 1994. Thibault was named 1993 Sportsman of the Year by the Omaha sportscasters, and ranks sixth on the CBA all-time coaching victory list (236). In March of 1995, he coached the silver medal winning USA National Team at the Pan American Games, and in August of 1993, he served as head coach of the gold medal-winning USA National Team at the World Championship Qualifying Tournament in Puerto Rico. He spent the 1997-98 season as a scout for the Seattle Sonics.

Mike and his wife Nanci are active participants in the community, and have been staunch supporters of the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation since Mike's days with the Omaha Racers. In 2007, the Thibaults were co-chairs of GREAT STRIDES, the primary fundraiser of the CF Foundation's Connecticut Chapter. Mike and Nanci have two children. Eric is a graduate of the University of Missouri, and a graduate assistant coach for the St. John's women's basketball team. He has also been an assistant to the Sun coaching staff. Carly is attending Monmouth University on a basketball scholarship.
