Last Game: Sunday, Sept. 8 – Los Angeles 77, Minnesota 68

Riquna Williams tallied 10 points in the opening five minutes of the second half – capped by a four-point play – to help Los Angeles pull away from the Lynx, 77-68, on Sunday afternoon at Staples Center. Minnesota ran off nine unanswered points to grab the early lead before Chelsea Gray fueled a 10-0 finish to the first quarter that put the Sparks on top 19-16. Neither team led by more than four points in the second, with Lexie Brown's go-ahead 3-pointer being matched by Williams and Nneka Ogwumike giving L.A. the lead for good at 34-32. Clinging to a two-point halftime lead, Williams began the third period with back-to-back triples before converting her four-point play at the 5:46 mark to push the Sparks' advantage to 48-38. The margin crested at 13 on Chiney Ogwumike's three-point play early in the fourth, but the Lynx scrambled back to within 71-65 on a Napheesa Collier jumper with 2:23 to play. Following a timeout, Marina Mabrey staged the comeback bid with a 3-pointer to put the game out of reach. Williams finished with 15 points and Gray added 14 for the Sparks while Collier led Minnesota with 16 points and 11 rebounds.

Previous Game: Friday, Sept. 6 – Minnesota 83, Phoenix 69

Odyssey Sims scored 11 of her 22 points in the pivotal third quarter and added a season-high nine assists to lift the Lynx past Phoenix, 83-69, on Friday night at Talking Stick Resort Arena. Brittney Griner's 10 points helped stake the Mercury to a 22-18 lead after one quarter and the margin grew to 36-26 on a DeWanna Bonner 3-pointer midway through the second. Minnesota finished the half with a 9-4 burst to slice the deficit to 44-40, then reeled off nine unanswered points to begin the third period. Sims' 3-pointer stretched the Lynx' lead to 12 and was followed moments later by Griner's ejection – setting off another 9-0 surge, capped by Lexie Brown's layup at the 1:19 mark, that gave Minnesota its largest lead of the night at 69-50. Sophie Cunningham halted the Mercury drought with a buzzer-beating 3-pointer, but Phoenix could get no closer than 13 in the fourth as the Lynx extended their winning streak to five and completed a sweep of the three-game season set. Damiris Dantas netted 17 points and Sylvia Fowles had 11 points and 11 rebounds for Minnesota while Griner led the Mercury with 16 points and seven rebounds before exiting.

This will be the fourth time the Lynx and Storm have squared off in the WNBA Playoffs. Seattle has won six of the past eight regular meetings, following a six-year stretch that saw Minnesota compile a 21-4 record.

First Meeting: Odyssey Sims' 15 points led four double-figure scorers and Sylvia Fowles hauled in 13 rebounds as the Lynx dealt Seattle a 72-61 loss on May 29 at Target Center. Natasha Howard topped the Storm with 18 points while Jewell Loyd tacked on 13 points and four steals.

Second Meeting: Jewell Loyd scored 19 points, including the go-ahead jumper with 3:48 to play, and Jordyn Canada contributed 17 points and seven assists to lift Seattle past the Lynx, 84-77, on June 4 at Angel of the Winds Arena in Everett. Alysha Clark added 16 points for the Storm while Napheesa Collier led Minnesota with 17 points and Sylvia Fowles tallied 16.

Third Meeting: Natasha Howard erupted for a career-high 33 points and Seattle nearly squandered a 21-point lead before regrouping to hand the Lynx a 90-79 defeat on July 17 at Target Center. Sami Whitcomb netted 15 points and eight assists for the Storm while Lexie Brown led Minnesota with 20 points and Danielle Robinson contributed 14 points and 10 assists.

Fourth Meeting: Jordyn Canada tallied 14 points and six assists, and Seattle withstood a third-quarter barrage from Odyssey Sims to post an 82-74 win over the Lynx on Aug. 18 at Alaska Airlines Arena. Natasha Howard and Jewell Loyd netted 13 points apiece for the Storm while Sims poured in a season-high 30 points and Napheesa Collier added 16 for Minnesota.

The Lynx spotted Atlanta an 11-point, 3rd-period edge before outscoring the Dream 42-15 over the final 15:06 to win by 16 on Aug. 6. A look at Minnesota's "volatility factor" for 2019:

LYNX TRAX: Minnesota completed its 21st WNBA season with an 18-16 record and the #7 playoff seed for a second straight year, thanks to a 5-1 stretch run highlighted by victories over Las Vegas, Chicago and Phoenix... Adding this year's 18 victories into the mix, the Lynx have bettered their own all-time WNBA marks for most wins in nine (218) and 10 (231) consecutive seasons; they also hold the records for six- (155), seven- (182) and eight- (200) year stretches... Minnesota opened 2019 by winning its first three games and matched that high-water mark when another three-game streak – featuring back-to-back road victories at Connecticut (74-71 on July 6) and Chicago (73-72 on July 10) – boosted its record to 9-6... The Lynx dropped nine of their next 13 starts, concluding with the 81-71 loss in Los Angeles on Aug. 20, to dip two games below .500 (at 13-15) for the only time this season... However, Minnesota responded with a five-game winning streak – including the third perfect homestand of 4+ games in length in club history – and officially clinched its ninth consecutive trip to the WNBA Playoffs by defeating Chicago 93-85 on Aug. 27 at Target Center...

GOING TO EXTREMES: The Lynx shot 58.8% Aug. 25 vs. Las Vegas, the 7th-best FG percentage in franchise history and bettering their previous season high of 53.7% set Aug. 9 vs. Connecticut; since the start of 2011, Minnesota is 78-3 when topping 50%... The 98 points vs. Las Vegas are the Lynx' single-game high since the 110-87 victory over Chicago on Sept. 1, 2017... During their recent five-game winning streak, the Lynx outscored the opposition by an average of 13.4 ppg (88.2-74.8), hitting 50.1% from the field... The 53-point total in Atlanta on July 12 is Minnesota's 2nd-lowest since the WNBA went to the four-quarters format in 2006 (51 vs. Indiana, June 6, 2010)... The Lynx posted a season low for FG accuracy in Atlanta (35.4%); the previous low (37.2%) was set in the July 10 victory at Chicago... Minnesota finished 6th in scoring (78.4 ppg), 2nd in FG accuracy (45.1%) and 6th in Offensive Rating (98.8)...

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Indiana shot 50.8% on Sept. 1, the Lynx' lone win in seven games this year when allowing 50%+ from the field; all-time, Minnesota has won just 15 of the 101 contests in which the opposition has shot 50%+ (eight of 31 since 2011)... Washington's 101 points on Aug. 11 are the most allowed by Minnesota in a regulation game since Aug. 16, 2011 at Connecticut... The Mystics shot 54.8%; overall, the Lynx were 5-14 when the opposition topped 42% and 13-2 when holding its opponent below 42%... Connecticut hit 30.9% on Aug. 9, Minnesota's best defensive percentage since limiting Indiana to 30.6% on Aug. 18, 2017... Minnesota held Phoenix to 38.7% on July 14; it's the first time the Lynx have strung together four consecutive sub-40% defensive efforts since compiling a run of six in a row in July 2013... Minnesota ranked 2nd in the WNBA in scoring defense (75.9 ppg) and 2nd in Defensive Rating (95.8)...

THE BOARD REPORT: The Lynx outrebounded Dallas 35-25 on Aug. 22, their sixth victory in eight starts this year when piling up a double-figure advantage; the Wings' three offensive boards equal the fewest by a Minnesota opponent this season... New York posted a 35-31 rebounding edge on Aug. 13, only Minnesota's third win in 15 games this year when facing a deficit (June 25 at Indiana, July 6 at Connecticut)... Washington racked up a 32-22 advantage on Aug. 11, just the 12th time since 2011 (second this year) that the Lynx have faced a double-digit rebounding deficit; they've lost all 12 of those games... Minnesota outboarded Connecticut 40-34 on Aug. 9, including 25-15 in the 2nd half; the Lynx finished 15-4 this year when holding the upper hand... For the season, Minnesota ranked 2nd in the WNBA in total rebounding pct (.519), 3rd in offensive rebounding pct (.279) and 3rd in defensive rebounding pct (.759)...

MARGINAL INFORMATION: The 98-77 win vs. Las Vegas on Aug. 25 represented Minnesota's second-largest winning margin of 2019 (32 vs. Connecticut, Aug. 9) and the 55th win in club history by 20+ points... The Lynx never trailed vs. Dallas on Aug. 22, their second wire-to-wire victory of the year (also Aug. 9 vs. Connecticut); five of their six August wins were by at least 16 points... The 101-78 loss at Washington on Aug. 11 is Minnesota's largest margin of defeat since a 100-76 loss at Chicago on July 8, 2017... The 89-57 triumph Aug. 9 vs. Connecticut equals the 5th-largest winning margin in team history and is the 10th time Minnesota has won a game by 30+ points – the first since beating Phoenix 105-69 on Aug. 22, 2017... The July 10 win at Chicago boosted Minnesota's record to 4-1 in one-possession games (decided by three points or fewer), tying the league's most wins in that category (Seattle 4-3)...

HUSTLE POINTERS: The Lynx outscored Las Vegas 50-32 in the paint on Aug. 25, the 21st time in franchise history they've tallied 50+ paint points (second this season: 50 vs. New York on June 22); Minnesota is 18-3 in those contests... The Lynx ranked 2nd in paint scoring (37.4 ppg) behind Las Vegas and 2nd in fewest paint points allowed (31.3 ppg), also behind Las Vegas... Connecticut outscored the Lynx 44-38 in the paint on June 14, the most points by a Minnesota opponent at home since Phoenix tallied 46 on June 7, 2016... It's one of eight times this year the Lynx were outscored in the paint (most recently 42-34 by Los Angeles on Sept. 8)... The Lynx netted 34 points from 21 Seattle TOs on July 17, equaling the 2nd-highest single-game point total in franchise history (35 vs. Los Angeles, July 26, 2011)... The Lynx committed just eight TOs at Dallas on June 30, tying their fewest since a six-TO night vs. New York on July 15, 2016... Minnesota ranked last in the WNBA in TOs per game (16.2) but 1st in TOs forced per contest (16.6); they also led the league in points off TOs (19.6 ppg) – the 4th-highest single-season average in the past 20 years and highest since 2012...
